## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school districts, requiring radon reports; and, in grounds and buildings, requiring radon testing.

- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
- 12 to read:
- 13 Section 223.1. Radon Report.--The board of directors of each
- 14 <u>school district shall provide written notice to the parent or</u>
- 15 quardian of each student within ten (10) business days of the
- 16 start of the school year. The notice shall include the following
- 17 <u>information:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) The date the radon testing under section 787 was</u>
- 19 conducted in the school buildings in the school district in the

- 1 prior school year.
- 2 (2) The highest radon level recorded and the school building
- 3 where the level was recorded.
- 4 (3) A statement, if applicable, that no testing has been
- 5 <u>conducted in a particular school building.</u>
- 6 (4) A statement that the United States Environmental
- 7 Protection Agency considers radon levels above four (4)
- 8 picocuries per liter to be potentially dangerous.
- 9 <u>Section 787. Radon Testing.--(a) Each school district shall</u>
- 10 complete initial radon tests in school buildings in the school
- 11 <u>district as follows:</u>
- (1) Except as set forth in paragraph (3), for a school
- 13 <u>building in existence on the effective date of this section, by</u>
- 14 <u>June 30, 2021.</u>
- 15 (2) For a school building constructed after the effective
- 16 date of this section, within nineteen (19) months of the date of
- 17 occupancy.
- 18 (3) For a school building in existence on the effective date
- 19 of this section but remodeled after the effective date of this
- 20 section, within nineteen (19) months of the date of completion
- 21 of the remodeling.
- 22 (b) Each school district shall continue to conduct radon
- 23 tests in school buildings in the school districts every five (5)
- 24 years after the initial test in subsection (a).
- 25 (c) The results of the radon tests shall be on file and
- 26 available for review at each school building within the school
- 27 district.
- 28 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
