## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), entitled "An act providing for the payment of death benefits to the 2 surviving spouse or children or parents of firefighters, 3 ambulance service or rescue squad members, law enforcement officers or National Guard members who die as a result of the 5 performance of their duties," further providing for title of act; and adding provisions relating to telecommunicators. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The title of the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, 11 No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement Personnel Death Benefits Act, is amended to read: 12 13 AN ACT Providing for the payment of death benefits to the surviving 15 spouse or children or parents of firefighters, ambulance 16 service or rescue squad members, law enforcement officers,\_ telecommunicators or National Guard members who die as a 17

- 2 Section 2. Section 1(a), (a.1) and (d) of the act are
- 3 amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to
- 4 read:
- 5 Section 1. (a) In the event a law enforcement officer,
- 6 <u>telecommunicator</u>, ambulance service or rescue squad member,
- 7 firefighter, certified hazardous material response team member,
- 8 member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol or National Guard
- 9 member dies as a result of the performance of his duties, an
- 10 application, including a certification of death, shall be made
- 11 to the department within three years of the date of such death
- 12 by any of the following:
- 13 (1) A political subdivision.
- 14 (2) A Commonwealth agency.
- 15 (3) In the case of National Guard members, the Adjutant
- 16 General.
- 17 (4) In the case of a member of a Commonwealth law
- 18 enforcement agency, the agency head.
- 19 (5) In the case of a campus police officer, the university
- 20 or college president.
- 21 (6) Any survivor eligible for payment of benefits under this
- 22 act or individual authorized to act on the survivor's behalf.
- 23 (7) In the case of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol, the
- 24 State Commander.
- 25 (a.1) A firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad
- 26 member, law enforcement officer, telecommunicator, certified
- 27 hazardous material response team member, member of the
- 28 Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol or National Guard member who
- 29 suffers a fatal heart attack or stroke while on duty or not
- 30 later than 24 hours after participating in a physical training

- 1 exercise or responding to an emergency is presumed to have died
- 2 as a result of the performance of his duties for purposes of
- 3 this act.
- 4 \* \* \*
- 5 (d) Upon receipt of such certification, the Commonwealth
- 6 shall, from moneys payable out of the General Fund, pay to the
- 7 surviving spouse or, if there is no surviving spouse, to the
- 8 minor children of the paid firefighter, ambulance service or
- 9 rescue squad member [or]\_ law enforcement officer or
- 10 <u>telecommunicator</u> who died as a result of the performance of his
- 11 duty the sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection
- 12 (f) of this section and an amount equal to the monthly salary,
- 13 adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of this section, of
- 14 the deceased paid firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad
- 15 member [or], law enforcement officer or telecommunicator, less
- 16 any workers' compensation or pension or retirement benefits paid
- 17 to such survivors, and shall continue such monthly payments
- 18 until there is no eligible beneficiary to receive them. For the
- 19 purpose of this subsection, the term "eligible beneficiary"
- 20 means the surviving spouse or the child or children under the
- 21 age of eighteen years or, if attending college, under the age of
- 22 twenty-three years, of the firefighter, ambulance service or
- 23 rescue squad member [or], law enforcement officer or
- 24 telecommunicator who died as a result of the performance of his
- 25 duty. When no spouse or minor children survive, a single sum of
- 26 \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of this
- 27 section, shall be paid to the parent or parents of such
- 28 firefighter, ambulance service member, rescue squad member [or],\_
- 29 law enforcement officer or telecommunicator.

- 1 (q.1) A telecommunicator shall be deemed to be acting in the
- 2 performance of his duties for the purposes of this act when
- 3 acting in accordance with 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 53 (relating to 911
- 4 <u>emergency communication services</u>).
- 5 Section 3. Sections 2 and 2.1 of the act are amended to
- 6 read:
- 7 Section 2. The following words and phrases when used in this
- 8 act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless
- 9 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Certified hazardous material response team member" means a
- 11 person who is part of a group of individuals who are certified
- 12 and organized by a Commonwealth agency, a local agency or a
- 13 regional hazardous material organization for the primary purpose
- 14 of providing emergency response services which is dispatched by
- 15 a public safety answering point to mitigate actual or potential
- 16 immediate threats to public health and the environment in
- 17 response to the release or threat of a release of a hazardous
- 18 material, which is certified, trained and equipped in accordance
- 19 with the act of December 7, 1990 (P.L.639, No.165), known as the
- 20 Hazardous Material Emergency Planning and Response Act.
- 21 Hazardous material response team members who are dispatched by a
- 22 public safety answering point may also be certified to perform
- 23 stabilization actions needed to remove threats to public health
- 24 and the environment from hazardous material releases. A member
- 25 of a for-profit hazardous material response team that was not
- 26 dispatched by a public safety answering point, is acting as an
- 27 agent on behalf of the spiller or responsible party or is
- 28 responsible for post-emergency or nonemergency response
- 29 hazardous materials/hazardous waste clean-up activities is not
- 30 eligible for compensation that is provided for under this act.

- 1 "Department" means the Department of General Services of the
- 2 Commonwealth.
- 3 "Firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or law
- 4 enforcement officer" means a firefighter; a member of a
- 5 volunteer fire company; a member of an ambulance service or
- 6 rescue squad; a peace officer as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 501
- 7 (relating to definitions); a public servant concerned in
- 8 official detention as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5121 (relating to
- 9 escape); an officer or employee of a State correctional
- 10 institution; guards or employees of county jails and prisons; or
- 11 any other law enforcement officer employed by the Commonwealth
- 12 or a political subdivision.
- "Public safety answering point" means the Pennsylvania
- 14 Emergency Management Agency-approved first point at which calls
- 15 for emergency assistance from individuals are answered, operated
- 16 24 hours a day.
- 17 <u>"Telecommunicator" means an individual employed by a public</u>
- 18 safety answering point as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 5302 (relating
- 19 to definitions), whose primary responsibility is to receive,
- 20 process, transmit or dispatch emergency and nonemergency calls
- 21 for service for emergency medical, fire and rescue, law
- 22 <u>enforcement or other public safety services via telephone, radio</u>
- 23 or other communication device. The term includes call takers,
- 24 emergency dispatchers and supervisors.
- 25 Section 2.1. This act shall be broadly construed to grant
- 26 benefits to firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad
- 27 members, law enforcement officers [or], telecommunicators or
- 28 National Guard personnel for deaths related to the performance
- 29 of their duties.
- 30 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
