## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in miscellaneous provisions relating 5 to institutions of higher education, providing for menstrual 6 hygiene products. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 2002-I. Menstrual hygiene products. 14 (a) Requirement. -- A public institution of higher education 15 shall make menstrual hygiene products available at no cost in 16 each bathroom of a school building, including all of the 17 following: 18 (1) A choice of at least two sizes or absorbencies of

sanitary napkins or pads that are capable of absorbing at

- 1 <u>least five milliliters of liquid.</u>
- 2 (2) A choice of at least two sizes of tampons that are
- 3 capable of absorbing at least four milliliters of liquid.
- 4 (b) Rules and regulations. -- The department shall promulgate
- 5 rules and regulations necessary to implement and enforce the
- 6 provisions of this section.
- 7 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 8 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 9 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Menstrual hygiene products." Tampons, sanitary napkins or
- 11 pads, menstrual sponges, menstrual cups and similar menstrual
- 12 <u>hygiene products.</u>
- 13 "Public institution of higher education." As defined in
- 14 section 2001-I(m).
- 15 "School building." A building owned by or under the control
- 16 of a public institution of higher education where classes are
- 17 <u>taught on a regular basis. The term does not include a student</u>
- 18 <u>dormitory</u>.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
