

# SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN & YOUTH BILL

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for definitions, for persons required to report suspected child abuse, for access to information in Statewide database, for release of information in confidential reports, for employees having contact with children and adoptive and foster parents, for volunteers having contact with children, for continued employment or participation in program, activity or service, for certification compliance and for mandatory reporting of children under one year of age. (Representatives WATSON, MOUL, HARHART and others) - Rules, June 10, 2015 3





This bill amends Title 23, providing for persons required to report suspected child abuse.


# SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 512 568 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and for transfer and articulation oversight committee. (Representatives ROEBUCK, BISHOP, V. BROWN and others) - Education, May 11, 2015 13

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for uniform standards for awarding college credit for prior learning at public institutions of higher education.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

HOUSE 283 282 An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in tax for education, further providing for exclusions from sales and use tax. (Representatives F. KELLER, BARRAR, CUTLER and others) - Finance, June 16, 2015 1

This amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 by providing a Sales and Use Tax exclusion on the retail purchase of gun locks and gun safes.

HOUSE 421 An Act amending the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, in senior citizens property tax and rent rebate assistance, further providing for definitions. (Representatives SAMUELSON, HENNESSEY, BARBIN and others) - Finance, June 16, 2015 1

*This bill increases the exemption for total death benefits from \$5,000 to \$10,000 when calculating income eligibility for the property tax/rent rebate program.* 

# SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 222 1587 An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, in public assistance, prohibiting eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution. (Representatives REGAN, SACCONE, BAKER and others) – Health, May 14, 2015 9

This bill amends the Public Welfare Code to prohibit benefits eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in bonds and recognizances, amending provisions relating to professional bondsmen and providing for authorization to conduct business within each county, for forfeited undertaking, for private cause of action and for third party sureties. (Senators ALLOWAY, KITCHEN, YUDICHAK and others) - Judiciary, June 15, 2015 2





*This bill amends Title 42 (Judicial Code) to privatize and regulate bail bondsmen.* 

# SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR AND INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 478 1421 An Act establishing guidelines and procedures governing certain investigations and interrogations of correctional officers by the Department of Corrections; authorizing certain civil suits by correctional officers; and providing for impact of collective bargaining agreements and for summary suspensions. (Representatives BOBACK, MATZIE, D. COSTA and others) - Labor & Industry, May 7, 2015 13

This bill Establishes the Correctional Officers Investigation Procurement Act.

An Act amending Titles 24 (Education), 51 (Military Affairs) and 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1555 Statutes, in Title 24, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and construction and providing for references; in retirement membership, contributions and benefits, further providing for mandatory and optional membership, for credited school service, for waiver of adjustments and for classes of service, for elections, for eligibility points, for eligibility for annuities, for eligibility for refunds, for pickup contributions, for member contributions, for contributions for purchase of credit, for annual compensation limit, for contributions by Commonwealth, for payments by employers, for actuarial cost method, for appropriations by Commonwealth, for return of accumulated deductions, for single life annuity, for disability annuities, for termination of annuities and payment of benefits; providing for school employees' defined contribution plan; in administrative and miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for administrative duties of board, for health insurance, for advisory and reporting duties, for application and election duties, for duties of employers, for rights and duties of school employees and members, for management of fund and accounts, for Public School Employees' Retirement Fund, for State accumulation account, for annuity reserve account, for State guarantee, for taxation, for OVER

This bill establishes the State Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for state employees who begin service on or after January 1, 2016 and the Public School Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for school employees who begin service on or after July 1, 2016.

#### SENATE 622 644 An Act providing for elimination of certain reporting duties of the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee. (Senators MENSCH, BREWSTER, SCHWANK and others) – State Government, June 16, 2015 1

*This bill removes certain reporting duties of the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee (LBFC).* 

#### **SENATE An Act authorizing the disposition of certain lands situate in Plymouth Township, Luzerne County, subject to Project 70 restrictions.** (Senators YUDICHAK, BAKER, BLAKE and others) - State Government, June 16, 2015 1

This bill authorizes the disposition of land owned by Luzerne County, and currently subject to Project 70 land use restrictions, to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.


