### SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL

HOUSE **512** 

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and for transfer and articulation oversight committee. (Representatives ROEBUCK, BISHOP, V. BROWN and others) - Education, May 11, 2015

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for uniform standards for awarding college credit for prior learning at public institutions of higher education.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

HOUSE **283** 

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in tax for education, further providing for exclusions from sales and use tax. (Representatives F. KELLER, BARRAR, CUTLER and others) - Finance, June 16, 2015

This amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 by providing a Sales and Use Tax exclusion on the retail purchase of gun locks and gun safes.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

**HOUSE** 421

An Act amending the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., 456 P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, in senior citizens property tax and rent rebate assistance, further providing for definitions. (Representatives SAMUELSON, HENNESSEY, BARBIN and others) - Finance, June 16, 2015

This bill increases the exemption for total death benefits from \$5,000 to \$10,000 when calculating income eligibility for the property tax/rent rebate program.

### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** HEALTH BILL

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, in public assistance, prohibiting 1587 eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution. (Representatives REGAN, SACCONE, BAKER and others) - Health, May 14, 2015

This bill amends the Public Welfare Code to prohibit benefits eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution.

### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** LABOR AND INDUSTRY BILL

**HOUSE** 

An Act establishing guidelines and procedures governing certain investigations and interrogations of correctional officers by the 1421 Department of Corrections; authorizing certain civil suits by correctional officers; and providing for impact of collective bargaining agreements and for summary suspensions. (Representatives BOBACK, MATZIE, D. COSTA and others) - Labor & Industry, May 7, 2015

This bill Establishes the Correctional Officers Investigation Procurement Act.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILL

**HOUSE** 603

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known 677 as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, further providing for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors, for restriction on the use of title "Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist" and for penalties. (Representatives GROVE, OBERLANDER, SCHEMEL and others) - Professional Licensure, June 18, 2015

This bill amends the Social Workers Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act to provide title protection for Marriage and Family Therapists.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

**HOUSE 727** 

An Act amending Titles 24 (Education), 51 (Military Affairs) and 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1555 Statutes, in Title 24, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and construction and providing for references; in retirement membership, contributions and benefits, further providing for mandatory and optional membership, for credited school service, for waiver of adjustments and for classes of service, for elections, for eligibility points, for eligibility for annuities, for eligibility for refunds, for pickup contributions, for member contributions, for contributions for purchase of credit, for annual compensation limit, for contributions by Commonwealth, for payments by employers, for actuarial cost method, for appropriations by Commonwealth, for return of accumulated deductions, for single life annuity, for disability annuities, for termination of annuities and payment of benefits; providing for school employees' defined contribution plan; in administrative and miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for administrative duties of board, for health insurance, for advisory and reporting duties, for application and election duties, for duties of employers, for rights and duties of school employees and members, for management of fund and accounts, for Public School Employees' Retirement Fund, for State accumulation account, for annuity reserve account, for State guarantee, for taxation, for attachment and assignment of funds, for approval of domestic relations orders, for irrevocable survivor annuitant and for amendment of approved domestic relations orders; providing for irrevocable successor payee; further providing for fraud and adjustment of errors and for payments to school entities by Commonwealth; providing for payments to school entities by Commonwealth commencing with the 2015-2016 school year; in health insurance for retired school employees, further providing for definitions; in Title 51, in employment preferences and pensions, further providing for military leaves of absence; in Title 71, in retirement for State employees and officers, further providing for definitions, for preliminary provisions and for membership, credited service, classes of service, and eligibility benefits, providing for

State Employees' Defined Contribution Plan, further providing for contributions, for benefits and for administration, funds and accounts; and making editorial changes. (Representatives KAMPF, ROSS, TURZAI and others) – State Government, May 14, 2015

This bill establishes the State Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for state employees who begin service on or after January 1, 2016 and the Public School Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for school employees who begin service on or after July 1, 2016.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILL

**HOUSE 824**

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, providing for confidentiality of personal information of public safety officials. (Representatives PETRI, KORTZ, FARRY and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, June 2, 2015

This bill protects the confidential information of public safety officials.
