## **SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILLS**

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Titles 53 (Municipalities Generally), 66 (Public Utilities) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1721 Statutes, in taxicabs and limousines in first class cities, further providing for definitions; in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in powers and duties, providing for financial responsibility of transportation network companies; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; providing for transportation network service; and, in general provisions, further providing for definitions. (Representatives MAHER, VEREB, KILLION and others) - Consumer Affairs, May 18, 2016

OVER

This bill amends Titles 53, 66 & 75 by establishing licensing requirements and service standards for transportation network companies.

**SENATE 874** 

An Act amending the act of August 14, 1963 (P.L.1059, No.459), referred to as the Cemetery and Funeral Merchandise Trust Fund 1334 Law, further providing for deposits into merchandise trust funds; providing for price and description reports; and further providing for funds held in trust, for payments from merchandise trust funds, for filing of financial reports and for penalty. (Senators McGARRIGLE, TOMLINSON, RAFFERTY and others) - Consumer Affairs, May 2, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Cemetery and Funeral Merchandise Trust Fund Law to modify the process governing the sale of cemetery and funeral merchandise and to prohibit pre-need delivery except in certain situations.

**SENATE** 307

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 1138 known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in organization of departmental administrative boards and commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, further providing for the Environmental Quality Board. (Senators YUDICHAK, FONTANA, COSTA and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, April 11, 2016

OVER

This bill amends The Administrative Code of 1929 to provide for the Environmental Quality Board.

## **SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS**

**HOUSE** 1246

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives YOUNGBLOOD, CRUZ. DONATUCCI and others) - Finance. April 4. 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to tax all lottery winnings.

**SENATE 356** 

An Act amending the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, in consolidated collection of local income taxes, providing for the definition of "farming" and further providing for declaration and payment of income taxes and for withholding and remittance. (Senators FOLMER.) EICHELBERGER, BROWNE and others) - Finance, May 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Local Tax Enabling Act to clarify certain provisions related to the consolidated collection of local income taxes.

An Act amending Title 4 (Amusements) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in administration and enforcement relating to gaming, further providing for compulsive and problem gambling program. (Representatives ORTITAY, BAKER, V. BROWN and others) - Gaming Oversight, May 3, 2016

This bill amends Title 4 to require the Department of Health to maintain one problem gambling toll-free number that all casinos must use.

HOUSE 1925 3194

An Act amending Title 4 (Amusements) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in revenues, further providing for transfers from State Gaming Fund. (Representatives SANTORA, JOZWIAK, NEILSON and others) - Gaming Oversight, May 3, 2016

VOTE

This bill amends Title 4 to permit PSP to use Local Law Enforcement Grants in any municipality and to require uncommitted LLEG amounts to be annually transferred to the Compulsive and Problem Gambling Treatment Fund.

HOUSE 479 3070

An Act amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known as The Professional Nursing Law, providing for delegation of functions necessary for the support of nursing services. (Representatives FABRIZIO, McNEILL, KINSEY and others) – Health, April 11, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Professional Nursing Law pertaining to the delegation of certain nursing care tasks.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE 1064

An Act amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, in medical professional liability, providing for emergency care. (Representatives EVANKOVICH, CUTLER, SACCONE and others) – Insurance, May 23, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Act to provide qualified immunity to a health care provider who delivers emergency health care services.

HOUSE 585 3369

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in anatomical gifts, further providing for manner of executing anatomical gifts. (Representatives PETRARCA, BARRAR, BISHOP and others) - Judiciary, May 23, 2016

VOTE

This bill amends Title 20 to provide for candidates for transplants who are disabled.

HOUSE

1339 1821 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in burglary and other criminal intrusion, providing for the offense of criminal surveillance. (Representatives PYLE, KOTIK, WARNER and others) – Judiciary, May 16, 2016

OVER

This bill amends Title 18 providing for the offense of criminal surveillance.

OVER

This bill provides for limits on counties of the second class in fiscal affairs.

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for limitation on tax increase after reassessment. countywide (Senators HUTCHINSON, EICHELBERGER, McGARRIGLE and others) - Local Government, **April 6, 2016** 12

OVER

This bill provides for limitation on tax increase after countywide reassessment.

OVER

This bill permits public employees with a religious objection to send their fair share fees to any recognized nonreligious 501C3 charity of their choosing.

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Titles 24 (Education), 51 (Military Affairs) and 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Title 24, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and construction and providing for references; in retirement membership, contributions and benefits, further providing for mandatory and optional membership, for credited school service, for waiver of adjustments and for classes of service, for elections,

This bill establishes the State Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for state employees who begin service on or after January 1, 2016 and the Public School Employees' Defined Contribution Plan for school employees who begin service on or after July 1, 2016.

An Act amending Titles 24 (Education), 51 (Military Affairs) and 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, extensively revising pension provisions: for the Public School Employees' Retirement System, in the areas of preliminary provisions, of membership, contributions and benefits, of School Employees' Defined Contribution Plan, of administration and miscellaneous provisions and of health insurance for retired school employees; for military pensions, in the area of military leave of absence; for the State Employees' Retirement System, in the areas of preliminary provisions, of membership, credited service, classes of service and eligibility for benefits, of contributions, of benefits,

HOUSE

An Act authorizing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Department of Transportation and the Governor, to grant and convey, at a price to be determined through a competitive bid process, certain lands, buildings and improvements situate in Lawrence Township, Clearfield County. (Representatives SANKEY AND GABLER) - State Government, May 24, 2016

This bill authorizes the conveyance of land in Lawrence Township, Clearfield County.

**SENATE** 501

An Act providing for protection of paychecks of certain workers and for the collection of political contributions. (Senators 1516 EICHELBERGER, SCARNATI, BARTOLOTTA and others) - State Government, April 12, 2016

OVER

10

This bill prohibits the collection of political constitutions via the public payroll system.

**SENATE** 645

An Act providing for notice and disclosure of proposed collective bargaining agreements and related documents and for open records. (Senators STEFANO, SCARNATI, CORMAN and others) - State Government, May 23, 2016

OVER

This bill requires that a public employer shall provide notice prior to signing a proposed collective bargaining agreement.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE 1551 2636

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other required equipment, further providing for restraint systems; and making an editorial change. (Representatives SCHLOSSBERG, STEPHENS, O'BRIEN and others) - Transportation, April 5, 2016

OVER

This bill amends the Vehicle Code to require that children under one year of age be secured in a rear-facing child seat.

HOUSE 1740 2619

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for police reports. (Representatives DIAMOND, BOBACK, COHEN and others) – Transportation, April 4, 2016

OVER

This bill amends Title 75 further providing for maximum cost of furnishing police reports.

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code of 1949, providing for school director training programs.

This bill amends Title 34 to provide that antlerless deer licenses be issued by the PA Game Commission or authorized issuing agents.


