SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL

HOUSE **512**

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and for transfer and articulation oversight committee. (Representatives ROEBUCK, BISHOP, V. BROWN and others) – Education, March 2, 2015

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for uniform standards for awarding college credit for prior learning at public institutions of higher education.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 700

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in powers of attorney, further providing for general provisions and for durable powers of attorney. (Representatives BIZZARRO, COHEN, KOTIK and others) – Judiciary, April 20, 2015

This bill amends Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries Code) to add criminal liability language to the acknowledgement that an agent signs with respect to a power of attorney.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE **665**

An Act amending Titles 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) and 57 (Notaries Public) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in powers of attorney, further providing for general provisions; and, in Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Acts, further providing for short form certificates, for implementation of power of attorney and for durable powers of attorney. (Representatives M. K. KELLER, GRELL, BLOOM and others) – Judiciary, April 20, 2015

This bill corrects provisions in Act 95 of 2014 relating to commercial powers of attorney.

HOUSE 874 1069

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offenses of harassment, stalking and threat to use weapons of mass destruction. (Representatives MARSICO, BLOOM, SAYLOR and others) – Judiciary, April 20, 2015

This bill amends Title 18 regarding harassment, stalking and threat to use weapons of mass destruction, in order to remove special exemptions for a party engaged in an organized labor dispute.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILL

HOUSE 92

An Act amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," further providing for definitions and for civil penalties. (Representatives HARPER, BARRAR, COHEN and others) - Professional Licensure, April 20, 2015

This bill authorizes BPOA Commissioner to expunge the disciplinary record of a licensee, registrant, certificate holder or permit holder.
