SECOND CONSIDERATION **EDUCATION BILLS**

HOUSE

499

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of 1425 teachers, further providing for evaluation of applications for certification. (Representatives EMRICK, DUNBAR, HELM and others) - Education, May 6, 2015

VOTE

This bill amends the Public School Code to require a teacher preparation program to recommend applicants for certification who meet certain grade point average standards.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and for transfer and articulation oversight committee. (Representatives ROEBUCK, BISHOP, V. BROWN and others) - Education, March 2, 2015

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for uniform standards for awarding college credit for prior learning at public institutions of higher education.

HOUSE

752

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, further providing for limitations. (Representatives CHRISTIANA, TURZAI, **SAYLOR** and others) - Education, May 6, 2015

VOTE

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to increase the amount of available tax credits in the Education Improvement Tax Credit program and the Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit program.



SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

805

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in professional employees, for temporary professional employees, for contracts, execution and form, for causes for suspension and for persons to be suspended and to receive tenure, for collective bargaining agreements and for timing of appeal of suspension; and

OVER

CUTLER and others) - Education, May 6, 2015

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for tenure after five years of service.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of teachers, further providing for certificates qualifying persons to teach. (Representatives O'NEILL, COX, EVERETT and others) - Education, May 6, 2015

VOTE

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide that an individual who does not hold a teaching certificate shall be eligible to teach as a substitute in a school entity for limited time periods if the individual meets certain requirements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

1005 100

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in tax for education, further providing for exclusions from sales and use tax. (Representatives F. KELLER, BARRAR, CUTLER and others) - Finance, May 4, 2015

OVER

This amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 by providing a Sales and Use Tax exclusion on the retail purchase of gun locks and gun safes.

HOUSE 421

An Act amending the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, in senior citizens property tax and rent rebate assistance, further providing for definitions. (Representatives SAMUELSON, HENNESSEY, BARBIN and others) - Finance, May 4, 2015

OVER

This bill increases the exemption for total death benefits from \$5,000 to \$10,000 when calculating income eligibility for the property tax/rent rebate program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

HOUSE 504

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in tax for education, further 561 providing for sales and use tax for timbering. (Representatives GABLER, BAKER, BENNINGHOFF and others) - Finance, May 4,

OVER

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to provide an exclusion from Sales and Use Tax (SUT) for timbering operations.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE

389

An Act amending the act of April 27, 1905 (P.L.312, No.218), entitled "An act creating a Department of Health, and defining its 1236 powers and duties," establishing the office of Chief Nursing Officer of the Commonwealth and providing for its powers and duties. (Representatives OBERLANDER, JAMES, **BARRAR** and others) - Health, May 6, 2015 1

This bill adds Chief Nursing Officer to the administrative structure of the PA Department of Health.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILLS

HOUSE 189

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions, in Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, further providing for general powers of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, in Pennsylvania liquor stores, further providing for sales by Pennsylvania liquor stores, in licenses and regulations, further providing for shipment of wine into Commonwealth and, in distilleries, wineries, warehouses, bailees and transporters, further providing for limited wineries. (Representatives SONNEY, BARRAR, D. COSTA and others) - Liquor Control, May 6, 2015

VOTE



This bill amends the Liquor Code (Title 47) to allow for the direct shipment of wine to residents of the Commonwealth.

HOUSE 619

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations, further providing for wine auction permits. (Representatives SIMMONS, COHEN. MILLARD and others) - Liquor Control. May 6, 2015

VOTE

This bill amends the Liquor Code (Title 47) to allow colleges and universities to obtain wine auction permits.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILLS

HOUSE 770

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in preliminary provisions, further 1423 defining "eligible entity"; and, in licenses and regulations for liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for unlawful acts relative to liquor, malt and brewed beverages and licensees. (Representatives MASSER, SCHREIBER, PICKETT and others) - Liquor Control, May 6, 2015

VOTE



This bill amends the Liquor Code (Title 47) to allow licensed establishments to offer discounts to members of "Mug Clubs" and to permit a new entity to obtain a special occasion permit.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

SENATE **266**

An Act authorizing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Governor and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, to grant and convey to the Bear Valley Franklin County Pennsylvania Joint Authority, or its assigns, two permanent utility and access easements from lands of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at the Fort Loudon Historical Site situate in Peters Township, Franklin County, for purpose of groundwater withdrawal. (Senator EICHELBERGER) - State Government, May 6, 2015

This bill authorizes the conveyance of two permanent utility and access easements in Peters Township, Franklin County.
