An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in transfers of credits 568 between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and for transfer and articulation oversight committee. (Representatives ROEBUCK, BISHOP, V. BROWN and others) - Education, November 5, 2015

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for uniform standards for awarding college credit for prior learning at public institutions of higher education.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL**

SENATE An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in organization of 1138 departmental administrative boards and commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, further providing for the Environmental Quality Board. (Senators YUDICHAK, FONTANA, COSTA and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, October 20. 2015

OVER

This bill amends The Administrative Code of 1929 to provide for the Environmental Quality Board.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **FINANCE BILLS**

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in tax for education, further **282** providing for exclusions from sales and use tax. (Representatives F. KELLER, BARRAR, CUTLER and others) - Finance, October 27, 2015 5

OVER

This amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 by providing a Sales and Use Tax exclusion on the retail purchase of gun locks and gun safes.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, in senior 456 citizens property tax and rent rebate assistance, further providing for definitions. (Representatives SAMUELSON, HENNESSEY, BARBIN and others) - Finance, October 27, 2015 5

OVER

This bill increases the exemption for total death benefits from \$5,000 to \$10,000 when calculating income eligibility for the property tax/rent rebate program.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, in public assistance, prohibiting 1587 eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution. (Representatives REGAN, SACCONE, BAKER and others) - Health, September 30, 2015 13

This bill amends the Public Welfare Code to prohibit benefits eligibility for individuals convicted of drug distribution.

This bill creates the Prostate Cancer Surveillance, Education, Detection and Treatment Act.



SECOND CONSIDERATION **HUMAN SERVICES BILLS**



This bill amends the PA Human Relations Act to remove all references to the word "handicap" while retaining disability as a protected class.

1336 A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and 2407 adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives CUTLER, DEAN, M. DALEY and others) - Judiciary, **October 21, 2015**

An Act amending the act of October 27, 1979 (P.L.241, No.78), entitled "An act authorizing political subdivisions, municipality authorities and transportation authorities to enter into contracts for the purchase of goods and the sale of real and personal property where no bids are received," providing for contracts for services. (Representatives ROSS, HARPER, GINGRICH and others) - Local Government, November 9, 2015

This bill amends Act 78 to authorize political subdivisions and authorities to enter into contracts for defined services when two consecutive advertisements fail to include bids.

An Act amending Title 11 (Cities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, consolidating The Third Class City Code; making revisions concerning records of ordinances maintained by the city clerk, bond, insurance and salary, qualifications for office of city treasurer, committee preparation of uniform financial report forms, observances, celebrations and recognition, selection of appointee from certified list of applicants and support of Pennsylvania National Guard units; making an editorial change; and making a related repeal. (Senators EICHELBERGER, HUTCHINSON, McGARRIGLE and others) - Local Government, November 9, 2015

This bill consolidates the Third Class City Code into Title 11 of the PA consolidated Statutes, with a few minor exceptions.

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in consolidated county assessment, further providing for definitions and for subjects of local taxation. (Senators EICHELBERGER, McGARRIGLE, HUTCHINSON and others) – Local Government, November 9, 2015 1

This bill amends the Consolidated County Assessment Law to correct a drafting error made when consolidating the major assessment laws and provides for further exceptions.

An Act amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69),
known as The Second Class Township Code, in township officers generally, further providing for removal for failure to perform duties. (Senators EICHELBERGER, HUTCHINSON, McGARRIGLE and others) - Local Government, November 9, 2015

This bill amends the Second Class Township Code by deleting current language that provides failure to perform duties as a cause for removal from office and adds language that references the Pennsylvania Constitution as the basis for removal.






An Act amending the act of December 8, 2004 (P.L.1801, No.238), known as the Transit Revitalization Investment District **1363** Act, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in TRID creation and location, further providing for criteria for proposed TRID, for TRID designation, for implementing authority, for TRID planning study factors, for roles and responsibilities of public transportation agencies and municipalities and for amendments to TRID planning study; in land development powers of public transportation agencies, further providing for development or redevelopment of property; in value capture approaches, further providing for creation of value capture area and for dedication of tax revenues; providing for capture of TRID tax revenue; and, in community involvement, further providing for public meeting to explain TRID and alternative implementation approaches. 
