SECOND CONSIDERATION APPROPRIATION BILL

HOUSE 785

An Act amending the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, in capital facilities, further providing for bonds, issue of bonds and notes, maturity, interest, for appropriation for and limitation on redevelopment assistance capital projects and for administration of redevelopment assistance capital projects; and providing for capital budgets. (Representatives SAYLOR AND TURZAI) - Appropriations, April 3, 2017

VOTE



This bill amends the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act to provide for issue of bonds and notes, maturity, interest for appropriation for and limitation on redevelopment assistance capital projects.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE **179**

An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in contract carrier by motor vehicle and broker, further providing for declaration of policy and definitions; and, in violations and penalties, further providing for unauthorized operation by carriers and brokers. (Representatives DAY, KNOWLES, D. COSTA and others) - Consumer Affairs, March 20, 2017

OVER

This bill amends Title 66 to increase penalties for unlicensed household goods movers operating in the Commonwealth.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

HOUSE 223

An Act amending the act of December 14, 1982 (P.L.1227, No.281), known as the Architects Licensure Law, further providing 192 for definitions, for powers of board and for issuance and renewal of certificates. (Representatives SONNEY, BENNINGHOFF, BLOOM and others) - Professional Licensure, April 3, 2017

VOTE

This bill establishes a continuing education requirement for architects.

HOUSE 445

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and 461 Professional Counselors Act, further providing for definitions, for reciprocity, for restriction on the use of title "licensed clinical social worker," for penalties and for unlawful practice; and repealing provisions related to appropriation. (Representatives MICCARELLI, NEILSON, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - Professional Licensure, **April 3, 2017**

VOTE



This bill amends the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act to require individuals who engage in the independent practice of clinical social work to be licensed clinic social workers.

HOUSE 539

An Act amending the act of April 16, 1992 (P.L.155, No.28), 565 known as the Assessors Certification Act, repealing provisions relating to nonapplicability; and providing for certification. (Representatives THOMAS. V. BROWN, **SOLOMON** others) - Professional Licensure, April 3, 2017

This bill amends the Assessors Certification Act to remove the exemption for counties of the first class.

HOUSE **548**

An Act amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," further providing for hearing examiners. (Representatives READSHAW, D. COSTA, BAKER and others) - Professional Licensure, April 3, 2017

This bill requires licensees of all boards and commissions within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs to report felony, misdemeanor or any drug violation convictions to their licensing board.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE **595**

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, as follows: in general provisions, 627 further providing for definitions; in management of the condominium, providing for alternative dispute resolution in condominiums and for complaints filed with Bureau of Consumer Protection; in protection of purchasers, further providing for effect of violations on rights of action; in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in management of cooperatives, providing for alternative dispute resolution in cooperatives and for complaints filed with Bureau of Consumer Protection; in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in management of planned community, providing for alternative dispute resolution in planned communities and for complaints filed with Bureau of Consumer Protection; and, in protection of purchasers, further providing for effect of violations on rights of action. (Representatives R. BROWN, BARRAR, DONATUCCI and others) - Urban Affairs, April 3, 2017

OVER

This bill provides powers to the Attorney General's Bureau of Consumer Protection to investigate and certain complaints in Title 68 communities.

HOUSE

758

An Act authorizing local taxing authorities to provide for tax exemption incentives for certain deteriorated industrial, commercial, business and residential property and for new construction in deteriorated areas of communities; providing for an exemption schedule; and establishing standards and qualifications. (Representatives WARD, STAATS, FREEMAN and others) - Urban Affairs, April 3, 2017

VOTE



This bill develops the Tax Exemption and Mixed-Use Incentive Program.
