9 (b) Options for amendment of network modernization plan. --Local exchange telecommunications companies shall have the 10 11 following options:

- (9) Effective January 1, 2024, the network modernization plans of all local exchange telecommunications companies shall be deemed amended to provide that the local exchange telecommunications company is not required to make broadband available under this chapter to any customer or location to which broadband is available from any other provider utilizing any technology.
- (10) Effective January 1, 2025, the network modernization plans of all local exchange telecommunications companies shall be deemed amended to provide that the local exchange telecommunications company is not required to make broadband available under this chapter to any customer or location.
- (11) Effective January 1, 2025, notwithstanding any other provisions of this title or any other law, the network modernization plans of all local exchange telecommunications companies shall be deemed amended to provide as follows:
  - (i) telecommunications services offered by the local exchange telecommunications company may be supplied using any technology, provided that the use of an alternative technology shall not be construed to grant any additional jurisdiction or authority to the commission over the service or technology; and
- (ii) the local exchange telecommunications company shall not have the duty to extend, expand or continue in
