48 (b) Major offenses.--A prosecution for any of the following
49 offenses must be commenced within five years after it is
50 committed:

occurs.
Section 911 (relating to corrupt organizations).
Section 2702 (relating to aggravated assault).
Section 2706 (relating to terroristic threats).
Section 2713 (relating to neglect of care-dependent person).
Section 2901 (relating to kidnapping).
Section 3301 (relating to arson and related offenses).
Section 3502 (relating to burglary).
Section 3701 (relating to robbery).
Section 3921 (relating to theft by unlawful taking or disposition) through section 3933 (relating to unlawful use of computer).
Section 4101 (relating to forgery).

Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
