Policy. 11 Public employment is a public trust. It is the policy of this Commonwealth to promote and balance the objective of protecting 12 13 government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by this 14 15 Commonwealth. Implementation of this policy requires that public 16 employees discharge their duties impartially so as to assure 17 fair competitive access to Commonwealth agency procurement by responsible contractors and that they conduct themselves in a 18 manner that fosters public confidence in the integrity of the 19 20 Commonwealth procurement process. It is also essential that 21 those doing business with the Commonwealth agencies observe high 22 standards of honesty and integrity. The General Assembly\_ declares that banning all types of political campaign 23 contributions by a contractor and those who desire to be a 24 contractor is necessary to prevent corruption and the appearance 25 of corruption that may arise when political campaign 26 contributions and the awarding of contracts with the 27 28 Commonwealth are intermingled. 29 Section 2. Title 62 is amended by adding sections to read: § 2301.1. Definitions. 30 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 31 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 32 context clearly indicates otherwise: 33 "Affiliate." Any of the following: 34 35 (1) A parent, subsidiary or otherwise affiliated entity

1 of an applicant or a contractor. (2) An officer, director, associate, controlling 2 3 shareholder, individual owner, partner or limited partner of 4 an applicant or a contractor. 5 (3) An officer, director, associate, controlling shareholder, individual owner, partner or limited partner of 6 7 a parent, subsidiary or otherwise affiliated entity of an 8 applicant or a contractor. 9 (4) A political committee controlled by an applicant or 10 a contractor. 11 (5) A political committee controlled by a parent, 12 subsidiary or otherwise affiliated entity of an applicant or 13 a contractor. 14 (6) A member of the immediate family of an individual 15 described in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5). 16 "Applicant." A bidder, offeror or other person seeking a contract, which is to be awarded under section 513 (relating to\_ 17 competitive sealed proposals), 514 (relating to small 18 procurements), 515 (relating to sole source procurement), 516 19 (relating to emergency procurement), 518 (relating to 20 competitive selection procedures for certain services) or 519\_ 21 22 (relating to selection procedure for insurance and notary 23 bonds). "Elected official." An individual elected by the public to 24 serve a term in an elective office. The term shall include an 25 individual appointed to fill an unexpired term in an elective\_ 26 office. 27 28 "Elective office." A position in a governmental body to 29 which an individual is required under the Constitution of the Commonwealth or by State law to be elected by the public. 30 "Immediate family." A parent, spouse, child, brother or 31 32 sister. 33 "Prohibited contribution." Any of the following: (1) A contribution made by an applicant or contractor or 34 an affiliate of an applicant or a contractor to: 35 36 (i) a candidate for nomination or election to an 37 elective office or to the candidate's political 38 committee; 39 (ii) an elected official or to the elected official's candidate political committee; or 40 (iii) a political committee not described in 41 42 subparagraph (i) with the purpose and intent that the political committee will, directly or indirectly, make 43 44 the contribution available to a candidate for nomination or election to an elective office or to the candidate's 45 political committee, or to an elected official or the 46 elected official's candidate political committee. 47 (2) A contribution made by a person to a candidate for 48 49 nomination or election to an elective office or to the candidate's political committee, or to an elected official or 50 51 to the elected official's candidate political committee, for

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1	<u>which a person who is an applicant or contractor or any of</u>
2	their respective affiliates acts as an intermediary.
3	§ 2304. Contributions by applicants and contractors.
4	(a) Applicants
5	(1) No Commonwealth agency may award a contract to an
6	applicant under section 513 (relating to competitive sealed
7	proposals), 514 (relating to small procurements), 515
8	(relating to sole source procurement), 516 (relating to
9	emergency procurement), 518 (relating to competitive
10	selection procedures for certain services) or 519 (relating
11	to selection procedure for insurance and notary bonds) if the
12	applicant or an affiliate of the applicant has made a
13	prohibited contribution within four years prior to becoming
14	an applicant.
15	(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3), an applicant
16	shall submit a signed affidavit to the agency with other bid
17	or proposal materials relating to the contract on or prior to
18	the time and date established by the agency for receipt of
19	bids or proposals. The affidavit shall be made under oath and
20	shall state that neither the applicant nor any of the
21	applicant's affiliates has made a prohibited contribution
22	within four years prior to the applicant's becoming an
23	applicant.
24	(3) For contracts to be awarded under section 514, 515
25	or 516 that do not require the submission of bids or offers,
26	an applicant shall submit a signed affidavit as directed by
27	the agency, but prior to the agency's award of the contract.
28	(4) A bid or offer made without a signed affidavit shall
29	<u>not be considered a responsive bid or offer.</u>
30	(b) Contractors
31	(1) A contractor who has been awarded a contract under
32	<u>section 513, 514, 515, 516, 518 or 519 shall not make a</u>
33	prohibited contribution and shall prohibit the contractor's
34	affiliates from making a prohibited contribution, during the
35	term of the contract.
36	(2) Each contract awarded under section 513, 514, 515,
37	<u>516, 518 or 519 shall contain a provision requiring the</u>
38	<u>contractor to submit a signed affidavit made under oath,</u>
39	stating that the contractor and all of its affiliates are in
40	<u>compliance with the requirements of paragraph (1). The</u>
41	affidavit shall be submitted at the commencement of the
42	<u>contract, on each anniversary of the commencement of the</u>
43	<u>contract and upon expiration of the contract.</u>
44	<u>(c) Form of affidavit</u>
45	(1) The Department of General Services shall develop the
46	form of affidavit to be used by applicants and contractors
47	under this section.
48	(2) All invitations for bids, requests for proposals and
49	other agency communications with prospective contractors
50	regarding a contract awarded under section 513, 514, 515,
51	516, 518 or 519 shall include an affidavit form and

1	information regarding the prohibitions contained under this
2	section.
3	(3) The Department of General Services and the
4	Department of State shall post the affidavit form and
5	information regarding the prohibitions of this section on
6	their respective publicly accessible Internet websites and
7	shall otherwise make the forms and information available upon
8	<u>request.</u>
9	<u>(d) PenaltiesAn applicant, contractor or affiliate of a</u>
10	<u>contractor who submits a false affidavit or makes a prohibited</u>
11	<u>contribution in violation of this section may, in addition to</u>
12	<u>penalties imposed by law other than under this section, be</u>
13	<u>debarred or suspended under section 531 (relating to debarment</u>
14	<u>or suspension).</u>
15	(e) Application of sectionThis section shall apply to
16	bids, offers or proposals that are solicited, and contracts that
17	are awarded, on or after the effective date of this section.
