 - Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as (a) follows:
 - (1) Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl, a native of Shippensburg, lived most of his life a few miles from the bridge over Muddy Run. He crossed over the bridge on Sunday mornings traveling to church, spent many hours fishing with his father along Muddy Run and cooled off in the stream with his family during hot summer days.
 - (2) Private First Class Diehl graduated from Shippensburg Area Senior High School in 1967. During high school, he was a member of the wrestling team and active in Boy Scout Troop No. 251.
 - (3) Private First Class Diehl honorably served his country as a medical specialist with the 25th Infantry Division, 3rd Squadron, 4th Cavalry, Headquarters Troop.
 - (4) On December 10, 1968, in Hau Nghia Province, South Vietnam, Private First Class Diehl was killed when the vehicle in which he was riding was struck by an explosive device.
- 31 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on State Route 533 over 32 Muddy Run in Southampton Township, Franklin County, is 33 designated the Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl Memorial 34 Bridge.
- 35 Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and 36 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to 37 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

- Section 3. Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge.
- (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as 2 3 follows:
 - (1)Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher, a native of Chambersburg, served in the United States Army from April 19, 1943, to March 28, 1945.
 - (2) Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher was a highly decorated veteran of World War II, having earned the Purple Heart, Bronze Star, Combat Infantry Badge, World War II Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, European Theater of War Ribbon with one star, Good Conduct Medal, Marksman Badge with rifle bar and Glider Badge.
 - (b) Designation. -- The bridge on State Route 1004 over the Conococheague Creek in Greene Township, Franklin County, is designated the Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge.
