1 Amend Bill, page 1, line 4, by striking out "AND"

2 Amend Bill, page 1, line 7, by striking out the period after
3 "BRIDGE" and inserting

4 ; and designating the portion of State Route 2024 and State
5 Route 1016, also known as Monument Orviston Road, from the
6 intersection of State Route 2024 and Main Street in Beech
7 Creek Borough, Clinton County, to the intersection of State
8 Route 1016 and Kato Orviston Road in Curtin Township, Centre
9 County, as the CPL Milford H. Wensel Memorial Highway.

10 Amend Bill, page 2, by inserting between lines 29 and 30

11 Section 3. CPL Milford H. Wensel Memorial Highway.

12 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
13 follows:

14 (1) CPL Milford H. Wensel was born on December 2, 1948,
15 to Walter H. and Beatrice M. Wensel in Howard.

16 (2) CPL Wensel graduated from Lock Haven High School in
17 1966.

18 (3) In March 1969, CPL Wensel was deployed to Vietnam
19 where he served with the 3rd Squadron, 4th Cavalry, 25th
20 Infantry Division as a half-track operator.

21 (4) On June 5, 1969, at 20 years of age, CPL Wensel was
22 killed while going out at night for his half-track.

23 (5) CPL Wensel was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart
24 and the Bronze Star.

25 (b) Designation.--The portion of State Route 2024 and State
26 Route 1016, also known as Monument Orviston Road, from the
27 intersection of State Route 2024 and Main Street in Beech Creek
28 Borough, Clinton County, to the intersection of State Route 1016
29 and Kato Orviston Road in Curtin Township, Centre County, is
30 designated as the CPL Milford H. Wensel Memorial Highway.

31 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
32 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
33 traffic in both directions on the highway.
