(C) A person who has been assessed by a physician or 10 psychologist as having a verified physical or mental disability, including a person who is a veteran with an illness or injury caused by or exacerbated by active military service, which temporarily or permanently precludes him or her from any gainful employment. The verification of the physical or mental disability must be established by written documentation in a form prescribed by the department and must be based on acceptable clinical and laboratory diagnostic techniques, rather than a statement of symptoms by the applicant or recipient[.]; except that, in the case of a veteran, the verification of an illness or injury resulting from active military service may be established by a statement from the veteran's physician, psychologist or from the proper military authority that has actual documented knowledge of the veteran's illness or injury. The department may also require the applicant or recipient to submit to an independent examination as a condition of receiving assistance. An applicant or recipient with a verified physical or mental disability which is temporary in nature shall pursue appropriate treatment as a condition of receiving assistance.
