- approximately 24 months of age. The following apply:
  - (1) A health care practitioner providing health care services to children under two years of age shall perform lead testing on those children, unless the health care practitioner, after querying the Statewide registry provided for under section 4(c), determines that the child has already undergone lead testing.
  - (2) A child who has not had his blood lead level tested between approximately nine and 12 months of age and again at approximately 24 months of age shall have his blood lead level tested as soon as possible after 24 months of age but before 72 months of age.
- (b) Additional testing.—If the results of a blood lead test indicate a blood lead level at or above the reference value for exposure identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the health care practitioner shall perform a confirmatory blood lead test by venipuncture within 12 weeks of the first blood lead test and within the time frame recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- 20 (c) Reporting.--Health care practitioners, health care 21 facilities and laboratories shall comply with 28 Pa. Code § 22 27.34 (relating to reporting cases of lead poisoning).
