1 Amend Bill, page 1, lines 14 through 21; page 2, lines 1  
2 through 30; page 3, lines 1 through 3; by striking out all of  
3 said lines on said pages and inserting

4 Section 1. Section 13.7(a) of the act of April 14, 1972  
5 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,  
6 Device and Cosmetic Act, is amended to read:

7 Section 13.7. Drug Overdose Response Immunity.--(a) A  
8 person may not be charged and shall be immune from prosecution  
9 for any offense listed in subsection (b) and for a violation of  
10 probation or parole if the person can establish the following:

11 (1) law enforcement officers only became aware of the  
12 person's commission of an offense listed in subsection (b)  
13 because the person transported a person experiencing a drug  
14 overdose event to a law enforcement agency, a campus security  
15 office or a health care facility; [or]

16 (2) all of the following apply:

17 (i) the person reported, in good faith, a drug overdose  
18 event to a law enforcement officer, the 911 system, a campus  
19 security officer or emergency services personnel and the report  
20 was made on the reasonable belief that another person was in  
21 need of immediate medical attention and was necessary to prevent  
22 death or serious bodily injury due to a drug overdose;

23 (ii) the person provided his own name and location and  
24 cooperated with the law enforcement officer, 911 system, campus  
25 security officer or emergency services personnel; and

26 (iii) the person remained with the person needing immediate  
27 medical attention until a law enforcement officer, a campus  
28 security officer or emergency services personnel arrived[.] ;or

29 (3) law enforcement officers only became aware of the  
30 person's commission of an offense listed in subsection (b)  
31 because the person reasonably believed that they were  
32 experiencing a drug overdose event or in need of immediate  
33 medical assistance and contacted or self-reported to a law  
34 enforcement agency, a campus security office or a health care  
35 facility.
