

## AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 364

1 Amend Bill, page 8, lines 20 through 30; page 9, lines 1  
2 through 30; page 10, lines 1 through 7; by striking out all of  
3 said lines on said pages and inserting

4 (1) The following shall apply to notice of violation:

5 (i) In the case of a violation involving a vehicle  
6 registered under the laws of this Commonwealth, the  
7 notice of violation must be mailed within 30 days after  
8 the commission of the violation or within 30 days after  
9 the discovery of the identity of the registered owner,  
10 whichever is later, and not thereafter to the address of  
11 the registered owner as listed in the records of the  
12 department.

13 (ii) In the case of vehicles registered in  
14 jurisdictions other than this Commonwealth, the notice of  
15 violation must be mailed within 30 days after the  
16 discovery of the identity of the registered owner and not  
17 thereafter to the address of the registered owner as  
18 listed in the records of the official in the jurisdiction  
19 having charge of the registration of the vehicle.

20 (iii) A notice of violation under this section must  
21 be provided to an owner within 90 days of the commission  
22 of the offense.

23 (iv) The notice of violation shall have attached to  
24 it a copy of the recorded image showing the vehicle; the  
25 registration number and state of issuance of the vehicle  
26 registration; the date, time and place of the alleged  
27 violation; that the violation charged is under section  
28 3345 and instructions for return of the notice of  
29 violation; and for how to request a hearing with the  
30 magisterial district judge for the purpose of contesting  
31 liability or notice.

1           (3) The following shall apply to contesting liability or  
2 notice:

3           (i) An owner to whom a notice of violation has been  
4 issued may, within 30 days of the mailing of the notice,  
5 contest the liability alleged in the notice of violation  
6 by requesting a hearing with the magisterial district  
7 judge where the violation occurred and completing the  
8 payment of applicable civil filing fees.

9           (ii) The primary police department shall file the  
10 notice of violation and supporting documents with the  
11 magisterial district judge where the violation occurred  
12 and the court shall hear and decide the matter.
