1 Amend Bill, page 1, lines 1 and 2, by striking out all of
2 said lines and inserting
3 Amending the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1873,
4 No.1), entitled "An act providing for taxation by school
5 districts, for the State funds formula, for tax relief in
6 first class cities, for school district choice and voter
7 participation, for other school district options and for a
8 task force on school cost reduction; making an appropriation;
9 prohibiting prior authorized taxation; providing for
10 installment payment of taxes; restricting the power of
11 certain school districts to levy, assess and collect taxes;
12 and making related repeals," in senior citizens property tax
13 and rent rebate assistance, further providing for filing of
14 claim; and authorizing public school districts to implement a
15 senior tax reduction incentive volunteer exchange program.

19 Section 1. Section 1305(c) of the act of June 27, 2006 (1st
20 Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, is
21 amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to

23 Section 1305. Filing of claim.

25 (c) Payments from State Lottery Fund.--[No] Except as
26 provided under subsection (e) (3), no reimbursement on a claim
27 shall be made from the State Lottery Fund earlier than the day
28 following the 30th day of June provided in this chapter on which
29 that claim may be filed with the department.

31 (e) Claim for calendar year 2019.--

32 (1) Except as provided under subsection (b) and
33 paragraph (2), a claim for property tax or rent rebate for
34 calendar year 2019 may be filed with the department on or
35 before June 30, 2020.

4 (d) Discrimination prohibited.--This section shall be
5 enforced without discrimination based on race, color, marital
6 status, religious creed, ancestry, handicap or disability, age,
7 sex, national origin, the use of a guide or support animal
8 because of the blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the
9 user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or
10 guide animals under the act of October 27, 1955 (P.L.744,
11 No.222), known as the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act.

12 Section 1904. Personal income tax levied by the Commonwealth.

13 A real property tax credit received by a participant shall
14 not be subject to the tax imposed under Article III of the act
15 of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of
16 1971.

17 Section 1905. Existing job positions.

18 A program may not replace or supplant existing job positions
19 in a school district.

20 Section 1906. Funding.

21 School districts may seek private and public funding sources
22 to support a program.

23 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
