(i.1) Notice to sheriff. -- Notwithstanding any statute to the contrary:

- (2) Upon adjudication that a person is incompetent or upon the involuntary commitment of a person to a mental institution for inpatient care and treatment under the act of July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health Procedures Act, or upon involuntary treatment of a person as described under section 6105(c)(4), the judge of the court of common pleas, mental health review officer or county mental health and mental retardation administrator shall notify the sheriff of the county in which that person resides, on a form developed by the Pennsylvania State Police, of the identity of the person who has been adjudicated, committed or treated and the nature of the adjudication, commitment or treatment. The notification shall be transmitted by the judge, mental health review officer or county mental health and mental retardation administrator within [seven days] 72 hours of the adjudication, commitment or treatment.
- (3) The judge of the court of common pleas, mental health review officer or county mental health and mental retardation administrator shall notify a person who has been subject to involuntary treatment as described under section 6105(c)(4), on a form developed by the Pennsylvania State Police, of the person's obligations and rights under section 6105(a)(2)(v) and (f)(1) prior to discharge from inpatient care and treatment.
