- Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent 18
- 19 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific

- 21 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
- 22 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

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- "Certified driver rehabilitation specialist." An experienced
- practitioner in the field of driver rehabilitation training who, 25
- through successful completion of a formal certification 26
- 27 examination, has proven their capacity to provide driver
- rehabilitation services. 28
- 29 "Certified driving instructor." An individual who is
- certified by the Department of Education to teach the safe 30
- 31 operation of motor vehicles.
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- 33 "Low-vision rehabilitation specialist." An individual who
- has been trained and certified regarding bioptic telescopes by 34
- an appropriate training program as approved by the department. 35

The term includes an occupational therapist with specialty certification in low vision, a certified orientation and mobility specialist, a certified low-vision therapist, a teacher of visually impaired students, an optometrist, ophthalmologist 5 and other eve care practitioner. 6 7 Section 2. Learners' permits. * * * 10 11 (h) Requirements for a bioptic telescope learner's permit. --12 An individual with visual acuity less than 20/100 combined visual acuity but at least 20/200 visual acuity in the best 13 14 corrected eye shall be eligible to apply for a bioptic telescope 15 learner's permit provided the individual meets the following: 16 (1) The applicant is given a complete vision examination, including plotted visual fields, and meets the 17 18 visual requirements necessary for bioptic telescope driving. 19 (2) The applicant has color vision sufficient to respond correctly to the presence of, or changes in, traffic light 20 color, pavement markings, road signs, turn indicators, brake 21 22 lights, emergency flashers or the presence of other road 23 users, including emergency vehicles, as determined by a 24 qualified health care provider. 25 (3) The applicant provides proof of having a prescription bioptic telescope lens system in the applicant's 26 physical possession for at least three months, and a 27 statement of successful completion of at least 10 hours of 28 29 front seat passenger-in-car instruction while wearing a bioptic telescope by a low-vision rehabilitation 30 31 professional. 32 (4) The applicant provides a letter of enrollment with a 33 low-vision rehabilitation professional. (5) Bioptic telescope correction is no greater than a 6X 34 telescope and firmly fixed in the glasses or attached 35 36 permanently to the bridge of the frame. 37 (i) Issuance of bioptic telescope learner's permit. --38 (1) Upon application by an eligible individual, the department shall issue a bioptic telescope learner's permit 39 authorizing the permittee to drive only while wearing a 40 bioptic telescope lens and during 30 minutes after sunrise 41 through 30 minutes before sunset only. 42 43 (2) The bioptic telescope learner's permit shall be valid for 12 months. 44 45 (j) Authorization to test for driver's license with bioptic telescopes. -- The following shall apply: 46

The driving under this paragraph</u> 8 must include five hours of adverse weather driving. 9 (iii) After completion of the training and driving under subparagraphs (i) and (ii), the permittee must be 10 11 reevaluated by a low-vision rehabilitation professional. 12 Based on the reevaluation, the low-vision rehabilitation specialist may recommend the department schedule the 13 permittee for an on-road driving examination administered 14 15 by the department. (2) Paragraph (1)(ii) may be waived for experienced 16 drivers with stable visual acuity and fields of vision and a 17 18 clean driving record based on the recommendation of a lowvision rehabilitation professional. 19 20 § 1508. Examination of applicant for driver's license. * * * 21 22 (b.1) Issuance of bioptic telescope driver's license to 23 licensed nonresident. 24 (1) A driver wishing to transfer the driver's out-of-25 state bioptic telescope driver's license to this Commonwealth 26 must satisfy all the bioptic telescope-related requirements in section 1505 (relating to learners' permits). 27 28 (2) The department may grant a waiver of the 29 requirements under paragraph (1), provided the following conditions are met: 30 31 (i) The individual shows proof of at least three years of experience driving with a valid bioptic 32 33 telescope driver's license. 34 (ii) The individual shows proof of a clean driving 35 record for the previous three years prior to application 36 for a driver's license in this Commonwealth with bioptic telescope restrictions. 37 38 (3) The individual has been assessed by a low-vision 39 rehabilitation professional. The low-vision rehabilitation professional must determine whether the individual 40 demonstrates the appropriate skills to operate a motor 41 42 vehicle safely while using bioptic telescopes. 43 44 § 1512. Restrictions on drivers' licenses. 45 46 (c) Bioptic telescope restrictions. -- After an individual meets the bioptic telescope learner's permit requirements and 47 successfully passes a driver's examination administered by the 48 49 department, the individual may be issued a restricted license 50 with the following restrictions:

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(1) The individual's driving privilege is limited to

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roads other than freeways.
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- (2) The individual's driving privilege is limited to passenger vehicles weighing no more than 10,000 pounds and excludes operation of a motorcycle.
- (3) If determined by the department or low-vision rehabilitation professional to be appropriate, the individual's driving privilege may be limited to driving within a limited radius of the individual's residence.
- (4) If the individual has visual acuity of less than 20/50 vision using bioptic telescope lenses while driving, the individual may drive in daylight hours only.
- (5) If the applicant has visual acuity of 20/40 or better vision using bioptic telescope lenses while driving, the individual may apply for nighttime driving after one year provided:
 - (i) the individual has committed no violations of this title and had no accidents reported during that year; and
 - (ii) the individual is reevaluated by a certified driving instructor or certified driver rehabilitation specialist knowledgeable in the use of bioptic telescopes for driving, and the instructor or specialist recommends allowing nighttime driving.
- (6) A violation of a condition or limitation in this subsection shall result in the recall of the bioptic telescope license. An annual review of the individual's accident and violation history shall be conducted by the department. The bioptic telescope license may be recalled if the department determines that the individual was involved in an at-fault accident or convicted of two moving violations committed within a one-year period. A bioptic telescope licensee shall be subject to an annual vision assessment to determine whether the licensee's vision continues to meet the bioptic telescope-related vision standards in section 1505 (relating to learners' permits).

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44 (b) Exemptions.—The following persons are not required to 45 obtain a commercial driver's license in order to drive the 46 commercial motor vehicle specified:

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- 48 <u>(8) The following shall apply:</u>
 - (i) A driver who is 18 years of age or older and

1 employed by a political subdivision may operate a commercial motor vehicle within the boundaries of the 2 3 political subdivision for the purpose of removing snow or 4 ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding or salting, if: (A) the properly licensed employee who 5 ordinarily operates a commercial motor vehicle for 6 7 the purpose of removing snow or ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding or salting is unable to operate the 8 9 vehicle; or (B) the political subdivision determines that a 10 11 snow or ice emergency exists that requires additional 12 assistance. 13 (ii) The driver must have a certificate of authorization from the head of the political subdivision 14 15 while operating the commercial motor vehicle. An individual operating a commercial motor vehicle under 16 this paragraph shall not be subject to sanctions under 17 18 the provisions of this chapter or section 3742.1 19 (relating to accidents involving death or personal injury 20 while not properly licensed). 21 Section 5. Commercial driver's license qualification standards. 26 27 (c) Limitations on issuance of license. --28 29 (4) A person must complete training as prescribed by 49 CFR Part 380 (relating to special training requirements) 30 31 before taking the knowledge test for a hazardous materials 32 endorsement for the first time. 33 (d) Commercial driver learner's permit. --34 35 (4) A commercial driver learner's permit shall be valid 36 for a period of [180 days from the date of issuance and may 37 be renewed for an additional period of up to 180 days] one 38 year from the date of issuance without having to retake the 39 general and endorsement knowledge tests. 40 41 (12) A person must complete training as prescribed by 49 CFR Part 380 before taking the skills test for a Class A or 42 43 Class B commercial driver's license for the first time. 44 (13) A person must complete training as prescribed by 49 45 CFR Part 380 before taking the skills test for a passenger (P) or school bus (S) endorsement for the first time. 46 (14) The requirements of paragraphs (12) and (13) do not 47 apply to an individual who obtained a commercial driver 48 49 <u>learner's permit before February 7, 2020, or a later date as</u> permitted by Federal regulation, if the individual obtains a 50
