Canvassing of Official Absentee Ballots and Mail-in Ballots.--* * * 12 13 (1) (i) An absentee ballot cast by any absentee (q) 14 elector as defined in section 1301(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), 15 (q) and (h) shall be canvassed in accordance with this 16 subsection if the ballot is cast, submitted and received in 17 accordance with the provisions of 25 Pa.C.S. Ch. 35 (relating to 18 uniform military and overseas voters). 19 (ii) An absentee ballot cast by any absentee elector as 20 defined in section 1301(i), (j), (k), (l), (m) and (n), an 21 absentee ballot under section 1302(a.3) or a mail-in ballot cast 22 by a mail-in elector shall be canvassed in accordance with this 23 subsection if the absentee ballot or mail-in ballot is received 24 in the office of the county board of elections no later than 25 eight o'clock P.M. on the day of the primary or election. 26 (iii) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act to the contrary, during a disaster emergency and for sixty (60) days 27 following the termination or conclusion of a disaster emergency, 28 an absentee ballot cast by any absentee elector, an absentee 29 30 ballot under section 1302.1(a.3) or a mail-in ballot cast by a 31 mail-in elector shall be canvassed in accordance with this subsection if the absentee ballot or mail-in ballot is received 32 33 in the office of the county board of elections no later than 34 five o'clock P.M. on the seventh day following the primary or election. For the purposes of this subparagraph, the term 35

"disaster emergency" shall have the same meaning as provided 1 under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7102 (relating to definitions) and declared 2 3 pursuant to the provisions of 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301 (relating to 4 general authority of Governor). 5

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6 (2) The county board of elections shall meet no earlier than 7 the close of polls on the day of the election and no later than the third day following the election to begin canvassing 8 9 absentee ballots and mail-in ballots not included in the pre-10 canvass meeting. The meeting under this paragraph shall continue until all absentee ballots and mail-in ballots received prior to 11 12 the close of the polls have been canvassed. The county board of elections shall not record or publish any votes reflected on the 13 ballots prior to the close of the polls. The canvass process 14 15 shall continue through the eighth day following the election for valid military-overseas ballots timely received under 25 Pa.C.S. 16 17 § 3511 (relating to receipt of voted ballot) and for absentee ballots and mail-in ballots timely received under paragraph (1) 18 (iii). A county board of elections shall provide at least forty-19 20 eight hours' notice of a canvass meeting by publicly posting a notice on its publicly accessible Internet website. One 21 22 authorized representative of each candidate in an election and 23 one representative from each political party shall be permitted 24 to remain in the room in which the absentee ballots and mail-in 25 ballots are canvassed. * * * 26
