Assistance in Voting .--7 (a) [No] Except as provided under subsection (a.1), no voter 8 shall be permitted to receive any assistance in voting at any [primary or] election, unless there is recorded upon his 9 10 registration card his declaration that, by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write, he is unable to read 11 the names on the ballot or on the voting machine labels, or that 12 he has a physical disability which renders him unable to see or 13 mark the ballot or operate the voting machine, or to enter the 14 15 voting compartment or voting machine booth without assistance, the exact nature of such condition being recorded on such 16 registration card[, and unless the election officers are 17 18 satisfied that he still suffers from the same condition]. 19 (a.1) (1) Notwithstanding any provision of this act or any other law or regulation to the contrary, a voter who, due to 20 blindness, disease or other disability, is physically unable to 21 enter a polling place where ballots or an electronic voting 22 23 system are used at any election may vote without leaving a motor 24 vehicle. 25 (2) The following apply: 26 (i) The regular voting procedures may be modified by the election officer to the extent necessary to conduct voting under 27 28 this subsection. 29 (ii) If the exact nature of the voter's disability or condition is not recorded on the voter's registration card, the 30 voter may provide evidence of a disability or condition in 31 accordance with guidelines established by the Secretary of the 32 33 Commonwealth. 34 (iii) At least two election officers who are members of different major political parties shall assist the voter by 35 providing the necessary ballots at the polling place entrance or 36

1 curb, as the case may be. (iv) After the voter is accepted for voting, the voter shall_ 2 3 mark the ballot and give it to the election officers who shall_ 4 deposit it in the ballot box. The voter may request additional assistance as provided under subsection (a). 5 (v) On the voter's request, a person accompanying the voter 6 shall be permitted to select the voter's ballot and deposit the 7 ballot in the ballot box or enter the voting compartment or 8 9 voting machine booth in accordance with subsection (b). (b) Any elector who is entitled to receive assistance in 10 11 voting under the provisions of this section shall be permitted 12 by the judge of election to select a person of the elector's 13 choice to enter the voting compartment or voting machine booth with him to assist him in voting, such assistance to be rendered 14 15 inside the voting compartment or voting machine booth except that the judge of election, a candidate for election, the 16 17 elector's employer or an agent of the employer or an officer or 18 agent of the elector's union shall not be eligible to assist the 19 elector. 20 (c) In every case of assistance under the provisions of this 21 section, the judge of election shall forthwith enter in writing 22 in a book to be furnished by the county board of elections, to 23 be known as the record of assisted voters--(1) the voter's name; 24 (2) a statement of the facts which entitle him to receive assistance; and (3) the name of the person furnishing the 25 assistance. The record of assisted voters shall be returned by 26 27 the judge of election to the county board of elections with the 28 other papers, as hereinafter provided, and said county board 29 shall permit the same to be examined only upon the written order of a judge of the court of common pleas: Provided, however, That 30 31 such record shall be subject to subpoena to the same extent to 32 which other election records may be subpoenaed: And provided further, That the county election board shall permit any 33 registration commission to examine any records of assisted 34 voters without a court order, in order that the registration 35 36 commission may ascertain whether electors, who have declared, at 37 the time of registration, their need for assistance, actually 38 did receive assistance when voting at any election. 39 Amend Bill, page 98, by inserting between lines 2 and 3 40 (2) The amendment of section 1218 of the act shall take effect in 60 days. 41 42 Amend Bill, page 98, line 3, by striking out "(2)" and
