7 Section 412.2. Compensation of District Election Officers.--

8 (a) In all counties regardless of class, [the compensation of]  
9 judges of election, inspectors of election, clerks and machine  
10 operators shall be paid compensation as fixed by the county  
11 board of elections for each election [in accordance with the  
12 following:

Election Officers	Minimum	Maximum
	Compensation	Compensation
Judges of election	\$75	\$200
Inspectors of election	\$75	\$195
Clerks and machine operators	\$70	\$195]

18 , which amount shall be at least \$75 and not more than \$200.

19 (a.1) An election officer shall receive additional  
20 compensation, as fixed by the county board of elections, for  
21 participating in election training.

22 (a.2) A judge of election shall receive additional  
23 compensation, as fixed by the county board of elections, for  
24 picking up and returning election materials.

25 (b) If a county board of elections authorizes that the  
26 duties of a clerk of elections or machine operator may be  
27 performed by two individuals who each perform [such] the duties  
28 for one-half of an election day, [such individuals shall each]  
29 each individual shall be compensated at one-half of the rate  
30 authorized for a single individual who performs the duties for  
31 the entire election day.

32 (c) The county board of elections may[, in its discretion,]  
33 establish different per diem rates within [the minima and maxima  
34 provided for in] minimum and maximum rates provided for under  
35 subsection (a) based on the number of votes cast for the  
36 following groups:

1 (1) 150 votes or fewer.

2 (2) 151 to 300 votes.

3 (3) 301 to 500 votes.

4 (4) 501 to 750 votes.

5 (5) 751 votes and over.

6 (d) For transmitting returns of elections and the ballot box  
7 or boxes, all judges of election shall be entitled to receive  
8 the additional sum of [twenty dollars (\$20)] \$20.

9 (e) The county board of elections may[, in its discretion,]  
10 require the minority inspector of election to accompany the  
11 judge of election in transmitting the returns of elections, in  
12 which case the minority inspector of election shall be entitled  
13 to receive the additional sum of [twenty dollars (\$20)] \$20.

14 (f) The [person] individual furnishing transportation to the  
15 judge of election and the minority inspector in transmitting  
16 returns and ballot boxes shall be entitled to a minimum of  
17 [thirty-five cents (35¢)] 35¢ per circular mile from the polling  
18 place to the county court house. The name of [such person] the  
19 individual shall appear on the voucher of the judge of  
20 election[, and only one person shall] and only one individual  
21 may receive mileage compensation.

22 (h) When a primary and special election or a special  
23 election and a general or municipal election take place on the  
24 same date, [they] the elections shall be construed as one  
25 election for the purpose of receiving compensation.

26 (i) Compensation and other payments received by election  
27 officials [pursuant to] under this section shall not be deemed  
28 income classified and categorized under section 303 of the act  
29 of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the "Tax Reform Code of  
30 1971."
