Section 3354(d)(2.1) and (f) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 7 § 3354. Additional parking regulations. 8 9 (b.1) Protected pedestrian plazas and pedalcycle lanes .--(1) If there is an on-street pedestrian plaza or a 10 pedalcycle lane adjacent to the right-hand curb of a two-way 11 or one-way highway, a vehicle standing or parked upon the 12 13 right-hand side of the two-way or one-way highway shall be positioned in the direction of authorized traffic movement 14 15 with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel to and within 12 inches of the outside line of the buffer area 16 17 between the pedestrian plaza or pedalcycle lane and parking. 18 (2) If there is an on-street pedestrian plaza or a 19 pedalcycle lane adjacent to the left-hand curb of a one-way 20 or median-divided, two-way highway, a vehicle standing or 21 parked upon the left-hand side of the highway shall be 22 positioned in the direction of authorized traffic movement with the left-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel to and 23 24 within 12 inches of the outside line of the buffer area 25 between the pedestrian plaza or pedalcycle lane and parking. 26 (3) Nothing under this section shall be deemed to 27 prevent a local authority from enacting parking regulations under section 6109 (relating to specific powers of department 28 29 and local authorities) to provide for a special, alternative 30 or temporary configuration and signage for parking on a 31 highway with an on-street pedestrian plaza or pedalcycle 32 lane.

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- (d) Person with a disability and disabled veterans. --
- 36 (2.1) Local authorities may limit access to a parking 37 space reserved under paragraph (2) to a specific vehicle,

license plate or other method of designation. Under this paragraph, local authorities may charge a reasonable fee and shall comply with section 6109 [(relating to specific powers of department and local authorities)] and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat. 327).

(f) Penalty.--A person violating subsection (a), (b), (b.1) or (d)(1) is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15. A person violating subsection (d)(2) or (3) or (e) is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$200. If a person is convicted under subsection (d)(2) or (3) in the absence of a sign stating the penalty amount, the fine imposed may not exceed \$50. A person violating subsection (d.1) is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$300.
