AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 1279

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Amend Bill, page 1, by inserting between lines 14 and 15 1 2 "Compassionate care situation." Any of the following: 3 (1) An end of life situation. 4 (2) A resident struggling with the change in environment 5 and lack of physical family support who was living with family before being recently admitted to a facility. 6 7 (3) A resident who is grieving after a friend or family 8 member recently passed away. 9 (4) A resident who is experiencing weight loss or 10 dehydration and needs cueing and encouragement with eating or drinking which was previously provided by a family member or 11 12 caregiver. 13 (5) A resident who is experiencing emotional distress, is seldom speaking or crying more frequently and who used to 14 15 talk and interact with others. 16 Amend Bill, page 2, lines 9 through 15, by striking out all 17 of lines 9 through 14 and "(3)" in line 15 and inserting 18 (1)Amend Bill, page 2, line 18, by striking out "(4)" and 19 20 inserting 21 (2)Amend Bill, page 2, line 20, by striking out "(5)" and 22 23 inserting 24 (3) 25 Amend Bill, page 3, line 1, by striking out "Health OR THE SECRETARY OF" 26 27 Amend Bill, page 3, line 9, by striking out "allow" and 28 inserting 29 require

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Amend Bill, page 3, line 11, by inserting after "direction" 1 , including compassionate care situations 2 Amend Bill, page 3, lines 15 through 30; page 4, lines 1 3 4 through 6; by striking out all of said lines on said pages and 5 inserting 6 (b) Visitation.--Visitation by an essential family caregiver 7 may be conducted through different means based on a facility's structure and the needs of the residents, such as use of 8 resident rooms, dedicated visitation spaces and the outdoors and 9 visitation in circumstances beyond compassionate care 10 11 situations. The following shall apply: 12 (1) Except for on-going use of virtual visits, facilities may still restrict visitation by an essential 13 14 family caregiver due to any of the following: 15 (i) A COVID-19 county positivity rate greater than 10% according to the United States Department of Health 16 17 and Human Services Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 18 Services. The facility's COVID-19 status. 19 (ii) 20 (iii) A resident's COVID-19 status. 21 (iv) Visitor symptoms. 22 (2) Except as provided under paragraph (1), a facility may not restrict visitation by an essential family caregiver 23 24 without a reasonable clinical or safety cause. 25 (c) Essential family caregiver requirements.--The decision to designate an essential family caregiver may be individualized 26 and integrated with resident-centered care planning. A visit 27 shall be held outdoors whenever practicable. For inside visits, 28 29 the following shall apply: (1) Designation shall be by the facility executive 30 31 director or equivalent position or designee, in consultation 32 with the resident and the resident's representative, and only 33 upon agreement by the resident and their representative. 34 (2) A schedule and the amount of time allowed in a 35 facility by an essential family caregiver shall be agreed to 36 prior to an essential family caregiver entering a facility 37 and may not exceed more than two hours per day. 38 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, visitation shall be contingent upon the facility having no 39 40 new COVID-19 cases in the last 14 days. No facility may conduct visitation during the time period the facility is 41 42 conducting outbreak testing. (4) All who enter the facility must be screened for 43 44 signs and symptoms of COVID-19 and the denial of entry of 45 those with signs or symptoms must occur. 46 (5) Proper hand hygiene must be implemented. 47 The wearing of a face covering or mask covering both (6)

1 the mouth and nose must be enforced.

2 (7) Physical distancing at least six feet between
3 individuals shall be maintained by an essential family
4 caregiver with staff and other residents while in the
5 facility.

6 (8) An essential family caregiver shall provide care and 7 support similar in nature as provided prior to the 8 proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on 9 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), 10 and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.

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(9) An essential family caregiver shall adhere to any conditions specified by the facility.

(10) Restriction or revocation of essential family caregiver status shall be at the sole discretion of the facility executive director or equivalent position or designee.
