The act is amended by adding an article to read: 21 ARTICLE II-E EARLY DETECTION AND DIAGNOSIS OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE OR A 22 23 RELATED DISORDER 24 <u>Section 201-E. Scope of article.</u> This article relates to the early detection and diagnosis of 25 Alzheimer's Disease or a related disorder. 26 27 Section 202-E. Definitions. 28 The following words and phrases when used in this article 29 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 30 "Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder." An irreversible 31 32 and progressive neurological disorder diagnosed by a physician 33 that has all of the following characteristics: (1) The disorder causes cognitive decline and memory 34 impairment, behavioral and psychiatric problems and loss of 35 the ability to care for oneself. 36 37 (2) The disorder is severe enough to interfere with work 38 or social activities and requires continuous care or 39 <u>supervision.</u> 40 "Certified registered nurse practitioner." A registered 41 nurse licensed in this Commonwealth who is certified by the State Board of Nursing in a particular clinical specialty area. 42 "Clinical nurse specialist." A registered nurse licensed in 43 this Commonwealth who is certified by the State Board of Nursing 44 <u>as a clinical nurse specialist.</u> 45 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth. 46 "Physician." A medical doctor or doctor of osteopathy. 47 "Physician assistant." An individual who is licensed as a 48

13	Section 203-E. Primary care workforce education resources.
14	The department, in consultation with the Department of Aging
15	and other public or private organizations with expertise in
16	<u>cognitive decline, Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder,</u>
17	shall establish education resources to assist the primary care
18	workforce with the detection, diagnosis, treatment and care
19	<u>planning referral for individuals with Alzheimer's disease or a</u>
20	related disorder. At a minimum, the primary care workforce
21	education resources shall include all of the following related
22	<u>to Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder:</u>
23	(1) The importance of and value of early detection and
24	timely diagnosis.
25	(2) Increasing understanding and awareness of early
26	signs and symptoms.
27	<u>(3) Person-centered care delivery.</u>
28	(4) Cultural competency.
29	(5) Racial and ethnic disparities and inequities in
30	detecting, diagnosing and accessing treatment and services.
31	<u>(6) Use of validated cognitive assessment tools to</u>
32	<u>detect cognitive decline as part of the annual Medicare</u>
33	Wellness Visit or other annual physical examination.
34	(7) Sources of clinical practice guidelines and tools.
35	(8) Effective care planning, including treatment
36	<u>options, support and services, long-term care options,</u>
37	financial planning, advanced directives and care
38	<u>coordination, at all stages of dementia, including</u>
39	appropriate counseling and referral.

42	<u>(a) EstablishmentThe department shall establish and</u>
43	maintain an Early Detection and Diagnosis of Alzheimer's Disease
44	or a Related Disorder toolkit. The toolkit, at a minimum, shall
45	provide all of the following:
46	(1) Best practices and cognitive assessment tools,
47	<u>including the use of appropriate diagnostics, to assist the</u>
48	primary care workforce in the detection, diagnosis, treatment
49	and care planning for individuals with Alzheimer's disease or

26	the information on the toolkit established in subsection (a) to
27	reflect the most current and accurate information available on
28	an annual basis.
29	Section 205-E. Public awareness.
30	(a) Public informationThe department shall include and
31	make accessible on the department's publicly accessible Internet
32	website information relating to Alzheimer's disease or a related
33	disorder information. The information, at a minimum, shall
34	include the following:
35	(1) Understanding cognitive decline, Alzheimer's disease
36	or a related disorder, including the difference between
37	normal cognitive aging and dementias.
38	(2) Early warning signs of Alzheimer's disease or a
39	related disorder.
40	(3) The benefits of early detection and diagnosis.
41	(4) Importance of discussing cognition with health care
42	providers and tips on how to do so.
43	(5) Risk reduction behaviors to slow onset of cognitive
44	impairment, particularly among diverse communities who are at
44	greater risk of developing Alzheimer's disease.
