

AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 448

1 Amend Bill, page 1, lines 1 through 6, by striking out all of
2 said lines and inserting

3 Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 53 (Municipalities)
4 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and
5 other dangerous articles, further providing for limitation on
6 the regulation of firearms and ammunition; and, in home rule
7 and optional plan government, further providing for
8 limitation on municipal powers.

10 lines 1 through 30; page 5, lines 1 through 9; by striking out
11 all of said lines on said pages and inserting

12 Section 1. Section 6120(a) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
13 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
14 adding a subsection to read:

15 § 6120. Limitation on the regulation of firearms and
16 ammunition.

17 (a) General rule.--[No county, municipality or township]
18 Except as provided in subsection (a.4), no political subdivision
19 may in any manner regulate the lawful ownership, possession,
20 transfer or transportation of firearms, ammunition or ammunition
21 components when carried or transported for purposes not
22 prohibited by the laws of this Commonwealth.

24 (a.4) Exception.--A political subdivision may, by ordinance,
25 regulate the possession, transfer or transportation of firearms,
26 ammunition or ammunition components when carried or transported
27 on any property owned, operated or maintained by the political
28 subdivision, including, but not limited to:

29 (1) Buildings.

30 (2) Parks.

31 (3) Conveyances or vehicles.

33 Section 2. Section 2962(g) of Title 53 is repealed:

34 § 2962. Limitation on municipal powers.

1 [(g) Regulation of firearms.--A municipality shall not enact
2 any ordinance or take any other action dealing with the
3 regulation of the transfer, ownership, transportation or
4 possession of firearms.]

6 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
