5 (a) In the event a law enforcement officer, ambulance 6 service or rescue squad member, firefighter, certified hazardous 7 material response team member, member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol or National Guard member dies as a result of the 8 9 performance of his or her duties, an application, including a certification of death, shall be made to the department within 10 three years of the date of such death by any of the following: 11 12 (1) A political subdivision.

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(2) A Commonwealth agency.

14 (3) In the case of National Guard members, the Adjutant 15 General.

(4) In the case of a member of a Commonwealth law 16 17 enforcement agency, the agency head.

18 In the case of a campus police officer, the university (5) 19 or college president.

20 (6) Any survivor eligible for payment of benefits under this 21 act or individual authorized to act on the survivor's behalf. 22 In the case of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol, the (7)23 State Commander.

24 (a.1) A firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member, law enforcement officer, certified hazardous material 25 26 response team member, member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air 27 Patrol or National Guard member who suffers a fatal heart attack 28 or stroke while on duty or not later than 24 hours after 29 participating in a physical training exercise or responding to 30 an emergency is presumed to have died as a result of the 31 performance of his or her duties for purposes of this act.

32 (b) A volunteer firefighter shall be deemed to be acting in 33 the performance of his <u>or her</u> duties for the purposes of this 34 act going to or directly returning from a fire which the fire 35 company or fire department attended including travel from and direct return to a firefighter's home, place of business or 36 37 other place where he or she shall have been when he or she

received the call or alarm or while participating in instruction 1 fire drills in which the fire department or fire company shall 2 3 have participated or while repairing or doing other work about or on the fire apparatus or buildings and grounds of the fire 4 company or fire department upon the authorization of the chief 5 of the fire company or fire department or other person in charge 6 or while answering any emergency calls for any purpose or while 7 riding upon the fire apparatus which is owned or used by the 8 9 fire company or fire department or while performing any other duties of such fire company or fire department as authorized by 10 11 the municipality or while performing duties imposed by section 12 15, act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), referred to as the 13 Fire and Panic Act.

A volunteer ambulance service, certified hazardous 14 (C) 15 material response team or rescue squad member or member of the 16 Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol shall be deemed to be acting in the performance of his <u>or her</u> duties for the purposes of this 17 18 act going to or directly returning from an emergency which the ambulance service, certified hazardous material response team, 19 20 rescue squad or member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol 21 attended including travel from and direct return to an ambulance 22 service, certified hazardous material response team, rescue 23 squad or Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol member's home, place of 24 business or other place where he or she shall have been when he or she received the call or alarm or while participating in 25 drills in which the ambulance service, certified hazardous 26 27 material response team, rescue squad or Pennsylvania Civil Air 28 Patrol shall have participated or while repairing or doing other 29 work about or on any emergency vehicle or buildings and grounds of the ambulance service, certified hazardous material response 30 31 team, rescue squad or Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol upon the 32 authorization of the chief of the ambulance service, certified 33 hazardous material response team, rescue squad or Pennsylvania 34 Civil Air Patrol or other person in charge while answering any 35 emergency calls for any purpose or while riding upon any 36 vehicles which are owned or used by the ambulance service, 37 certified hazardous material response team, rescue squad or 38 Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol.

39 (d) Upon receipt of such certification, the Commonwealth shall, from moneys payable out of the General Fund, pay to the 40 surviving spouse or, if there is no surviving spouse, to the 41 42 minor children of the paid firefighter, ambulance service or 43 rescue squad member or law enforcement officer who died as a 44 result of the performance of his or her duty the sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of this 45 section and an amount equal to the monthly salary, adjusted in 46 accordance with subsection (f) of this section, of the deceased 47 paid firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or 48 49 law enforcement officer, less any workers' compensation or pension or retirement benefits paid to such survivors, and shall 50 51 continue such monthly payments until there is no eligible

beneficiary to receive them. For the purpose of this subsection, 1 the term "eligible beneficiary" means the surviving spouse or 2 3 the child or children under the age of eighteen years or, if 4 attending college, under the age of twenty-three years, of the 5 firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or law enforcement officer who died as a result of the performance of 6 his or her duty. When no spouse or minor children survive, a 7 single sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection 8 9 (f) of this section, shall be paid to the parent or parents of such firefighter, ambulance service member, rescue squad member 10 or law enforcement officer. 11

12 (e) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall pay out of the 13 General Fund to the surviving spouse or, if there is no surviving spouse, the minor children of a National Guard member, 14 15 certified hazardous material response team member, member of the Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol, volunteer firefighter, ambulance 16 service or rescue squad member who died as a result of the 17 18 performance of his or her duties the sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of this section. When no 19 20 spouse or minor children survive, the benefit shall be paid to the parent or parents of such National Guard member, certified 21 22 hazardous material response team member, member of the 23 Pennsylvania Civil Air Patrol, volunteer firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member. The benefit shall be payable 24 whether or not the National Guard member or certified hazardous 25 material response team member, member of the Pennsylvania Civil 26 27 Air Patrol, volunteer firefighter, ambulance service or rescue 28 squad member died as a result of the performance of his <u>or her</u> 29 duty within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

30 (f) On July 1, 2006, and each July 1 thereafter, the 31 Commonwealth shall adjust the level of the benefit payable 32 immediately before July 1 under subsections (d) and (e) of this 33 section to reflect the annual percentage change in the Consumer 34 Price Index for All Urban Consumers, published by the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Statistics, 35 36 occurring in the one-year period ending on January 1 immediately 37 preceding July 1.

38 (g) A National Guard member shall be deemed to be acting in 39 the performance of his <u>or her</u> duties for the purposes of this 40 act when:

41 (1) his <u>or her</u> death occurs in an official duty status 42 authorized under 51 Pa.C.S. § 508 (relating to active State 43 duty for emergency); or

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(2) going directly to or from the place of such duties.
