(2) The costs of prepared and unprepared food that went 34 35 unused as a result of an evacuation or diversion from the normal or customary operations of a school or educational 36

facility that responded to the threat. 1 (3) The salary or other wages, including overtime pay, 2 3 of any employee of a law enforcement agency, police 4 department, fire company, medical services agency, school district, educational facility or other governmental entity 5 for the time spent responding to the threat. 6 7 (4) The salary or other wages, including overtime pay, 8 of any teacher, administrator, aide or other employee of a 9 school or educational facility who was paid despite the diversion of normal or customary operations of the school or 10 11 educational facility. (c) Preservation of private remedies. -- No judgment or order 12 of [restitution] costs shall debar a person, by appropriate 13 action, to recover from the offender as otherwise provided by 14 15 law, provided that any civil award shall be reduced by the amount paid under the criminal judgment. 16
