A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the 110th Anniversary of the 28th Infantry Division 2 of the Pennsylvania National Guard.
- 3 WHEREAS, On March 12, 1879, the 7th Infantry Division of the

Pennsylvania National Guard was established by Governor Hoyt
 with the appointment of John F. Hartranft as Major General,
 Division Commander, National Guard; and

WHEREAS, The 7th Infantry Division participated in the
Spanish-American War, serving in Puerto Rico and in the
Philippines, and also served along the Mexican border during the
Mexican Revolution in 1916; and

8 WHEREAS, On October 11, 1917, the 7th Infantry Division was 9 redesignated as the 28th Infantry Division as a result of a 10 massive reorganization of army units; and

11 WHEREAS, In the global conflicts of World War I, at the 12 battles in Marne, Vesle River and Meuse-Argonne, and of World 13 War II, participating in the crucial St. Lo breakout, the 14 liberation of Paris and the bloody and critical Battle of the 15 Bulge in the Ardennes, the 28th Infantry Division served its 16 country and State in a magnificent fashion, participating in 17 both conflicts in the European theatre of operations; and 18 WHEREAS, As a result of the Korean conflict, the 28th Infantry Division was once again called in Federal service on 19 20 September 5, 1950, and served with NATO forces in Europe until 21 May 1953, when the unit returned to National Guard status; and 22 WHEREAS, Throughout the years, the members of the 28th Infantry Division have valiantly served the Commonwealth of 23 24 Pennsylvania by responding to control civil disorders and by 25 confronting the destruction caused by natural disasters, 26 especially floods, blizzards and hurricanes, most spectacularly 27 during the aftermath of floods in 1936, 1955, 1972 and 1975; and 28 WHEREAS, To this day, the 28th Infantry Division continues to 29 serve the Commonwealth and its citizens by being ready and 30 trained to respond to any emergency; therefore be it - 2 -19890H0014R0354
