- country is deficient in mathematics, science and technology
- opportunities; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The discoveries and knowledge gained from space
- 10 exploration and satellite technology development are valuable
- education tools not adequately utilized in the classrooms; and 11
- WHEREAS, The increasing application of space technology to 12
- 13 everyday life and industry requires an adequate work force; and

- 2 incorporates hands-on activities and real-life situations; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Exemplary programs such as West Chester University's
- 4 Educational Center for Earth Observation Systems need to be
- 5 replicated across the Commonwealth; and
