## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Urging members of the Pennsylvania Congressional delegation to 2 meet periodically with the General Assembly REGARDING 3 UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES. WHEREAS, The Federal legislative interests of the 4 Commonwealth are constantly evolving; and 6 WHEREAS, The communication of those legislative interests to Federal legislators will best be achieved through interactive meetings between the General Assembly and each member of 8 Congress from Pennsylvania; AND 10 WHEREAS, THE NUMBER OF UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES IMPOSED UPON THE STATES BY CONGRESS HAS ALARMINGLY INCREASED IN RECENT YEARS; 11 12 AND 13 WHEREAS, THIS CONTINUING IMPOSITION PLACES THE COMMONWEALTH

IN THE PRECARIOUS POSITION OF EITHER ATTEMPTING TO FUND THE

FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS WITH DIMINISHING AMOUNTS OF AVAILABLE

- 1 REVENUE OR JEOPARDIZING ELIGIBILITY FOR CERTAIN FEDERAL FUNDS;
- 2 AND
- 3 WHEREAS, STATES AND CONGRESS SHOULD ENGAGE IN EARNEST
- 4 DISCUSSIONS REGARDING THE DIFFICULT POSTURE IN WHICH THE STATES
- 5 HAVE BEEN CAST AND THE URGENT NECESSITY OF THE STATES TO RECEIVE
- 6 MONETARY ASSISTANCE FOR THESE MANDATES OR RELIEF FROM THE
- 7 ENFORCEMENT OF THESE UNFUNDED DECREES; AND
- 8 WHEREAS, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REQUESTS THAT ALL MEMBERS OF
- 9 CONGRESS FROM PENNSYLVANIA MEET WITH THE FEDERAL-STATE RELATIONS
- 10 COMMITTEE OF THE PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE
- 11 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE OF
- 12 PENNSYLVANIA AND ALL MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY CONCERNING
- 13 THIS CRITICAL PROBLEM SO THAT OUR FEDERAL REPRESENTATIVES MAY BE
- 14 COMPLETELY COGNIZANT OF THE EFFECT THE ACTIONS OF THE FEDERAL
- 15 GOVERNMENT HAVE AT THE STATE LEGISLATIVE LEVEL AND MAY BE MORE
- 16 SENSITIVE TO THE DIFFICULTIES THAT UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES
- 17 CREATE; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 19 urge each member of Congress from Pennsylvania to meet with
- 20 representatives of the Senate and the House of Representatives
- 21 at least two times per year CONVENED FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 22 DISCUSSING THE PROBLEMS RELATED TO UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES IN

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- 23 ORDER TO ESTABLISH AN ONGOING AND OPEN DIALOGUE BETWEEN THESE
- 24 PARTIES; AND BE IT FURTHER
- 25 RESOLVED, THAT THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE
- 26 PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE FEDERAL-STATE RELATIONS COMMITTEE AND THE
- 27 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THIS COMMONWEALTH AND
- 28 THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE PENNSYLVANIA SENATE
- 29 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE PRESIDENT PRO
- 30 TEMPORE OF THE SENATE DISCUSS THIS RESOLUTION WITH THE

- 1 BIPARTISAN LEADERSHIP OF THE PENNSYLVANIA DELEGATION TO
- 2 CONGRESS, IN ORDER TO MAKE THE NECESSARY ARRANGEMENTS FOR SUCH A
- 3 SESSION TO BE HELD IN HARRISBURG IN THE AUTUMN OF 1993 WITH THE
- 4 POSSIBILITY OF ADDITIONAL SESSIONS AS DETERMINED NECESSARY BY
- 5 THE HOUSE FEDERAL-STATE RELATIONS COMMITTEE AND THE CHAIRMAN AND
- 6 MINORITY CHAIRMAN OF THE SENATE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS
- 7 COMMITTEE; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 9 each member of Congress from Pennsylvania TO ADVISE EACH MEMBER <---
- 10 OF CONGRESS FROM PENNSYLVANIA OF THIS INVITATION AND OF ITS
- 11 HOPEFUL ANTICIPATION OF THEIR ACCEPTANCE.
