## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Declaring May 5, 1991, as "Jacob Lawrence Day" in the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Jacob Lawrence was born in Atlantic City, New
- 4 Jersey, in 1917 and spent his early years in Easton,
- 5 Philadelphia and Harlem; and
- 6 WHEREAS, As a teenager, he studied under recognized African-
- 7 American artists and came into contact with the leaders of
- 8 Harlem's intellectual community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, His paintings reflect the African-American
- 10 experience, with special emphasis placed on scenes from 19th
- 11 century American history and the Black experience; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In the late 1930's, Jacob Lawrence painted two
- 13 series of pictures depicting scenes from the lives of 19th
- 14 century African-American heroes, Frederick Douglass and Harriet
- 15 Tubman; and
- 16 WHEREAS, On May 4, 1991, the Philadelphia Museum of Art will
- 17 present the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman series of

- 1 paintings together in their entirety for the first time; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Jacob Lawrence will make a rare public appearance on
- 3 Sunday, May 5, 1991, at the Philadelphia Museum of Art; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Jacob Lawrence is an internationally acclaimed
- 5 artist and national cultural treasure; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives declare May 5,
- 7 1991, as "Jacob Lawrence Day" in the Commonwealth of
- 8 Pennsylvania.
