1	WHEREAS, The Army Corps of Engineers is currently undertaking
2	a study of the operation and maintenance of the Monongahela
3	River Navigation System; and
4	WHEREAS, There is a possibility that the level of operation
5	may be reduced; and
6	WHEREAS, The current deterioration of the locks is a major
7	problem confronting the steel industry of the Monongahela
8	Valley; and
9	WHEREAS, The economy of Southwestern Pennsylvania depends
10	heavily on the Monongahela River Navigation System; and
11	WHEREAS, The Commonwealth needs every advantage possible to
12	keep and create jobs; and
13	WHEREAS, Barge service is necessary for transportation of raw
14	materials for the steel and construction industries, vital
15	sections of the Southwestern Pennsylvania economy; and
16	WHEREAS, Barge service carries coal and fuel oil necessary

for heating Pennsylvania homes and businesses; therefore be it RESOLVED That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of the United States to oppose any reduction of the level of operation of the Monongahela River Navigation System; and be it further RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent to both United States Senators and every member of the House of Representatives from Pennsylvania.
