REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, NOVEMBER 20, 1975

In the House of Representatives, November 19, 1975

1       Some members of the General Assembly have been informed by  
2       their constituents that they are unable to secure any  
3       information concerning the whereabouts of their relatives who  
4       served in Viet Nam and did not return.

5       Some of these servicemen may still be in prison in Viet Nam  
6       and others may have been killed. These people deserve the right  
7       to know what happened to their loved ones yet it seems that  
8       efforts made to date to secure this information from the present  
9       Government in Viet Nam have failed to bring results.

10       The Republic of China has a great deal of influence with the  
11       Government in Viet Nam. It is possible that the Chinese  
12       Government could secure the needed information; therefore be it

13       RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of  
14       Pennsylvania memorializes the President and the Secretary of  
15       State to request the Government of China to intercede with the  
16       Government of Viet Nam and to ask them to supply any information

1 that they may have concerning the whereabouts of our missing  
2 servicemen; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to  
4 President Ford and Secretary Kissinger.
