A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing and honoring individuals and municipal employees for heroic actions during a recent fire in Philadelphia.
3	WHEREAS, On May 3, 1984, there was a nine-alarm fire in the
4	East Market Street shopping area of center-city Philadelphia;
5	and
6	WHEREAS, Approximately 20,000 customers and employees were
7	evacuated safely from the scene of the fire by business
8	proprietors, firefighters and police officers; and
9	WHEREAS, The firefighters successfully overcame the
10	conflagration with effective equipment, efficiency and a heroic
11	sense of duty; and
12	WHEREAS, The police officers maintained order and avoided a
13	major panic with superior skill and good sense; and
14	WHEREAS, The people at the scene avoided hysteria by acting
15	reasonably and with required restraint; and
16	WHEREAS, In the entire episode, not one life was lost;
17	therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
Commonwealth of Pennsylvania recognize and honor the business
proprietors, firefighters, police officers and people at the
scene of the fire for their outstanding actions; and be it
further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to the7 Mayor of the City of Philadelphia.
