A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring Sister Mary Reap, IHM, Ph.D., 10th president of
- 2 Marywood University, and designating May 4, 2007, as "Sister
- 3 Mary Reap Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, Sister Mary Reap has been president of Marywood
- 5 University for the past 19 years and formerly served Marywood as
- 6 dean of the Undergraduate School for Women and chairperson of
- 7 the Education Department; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Prior to her service at Marywood, Sr. Mary taught at
- 9 the elementary and secondary levels and worked in ministry to
- 10 the Spanish community; and
- 11 WHEREAS, A graduate of Marywood College, where she received a
- 12 bachelor of arts degree in Spanish, Sr. Mary earned a master of
- 13 arts degree in Spanish from Assumption College; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Certified in elementary and secondary education, Sr.
- 15 Mary received a doctor of philosophy degree in curriculum and

- 1 instruction from The Pennsylvania State University; and
- WHEREAS, During Sr. Mary's tenure as president, Marywood
- 3 received university status and became the first university in
- 4 the region to offer a doctor of philosophy degree program; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary oversaw Marywood's restructuring into four
- 6 colleges, added several new facilities and substantially
- 7 increased enrollment; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary oversaw the Impact 2000 campaign, the most
- 9 ambitious fundraising campaign in Marywood's history, which
- 10 surpassed its \$55 million goal; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Capital and endowment gifts during Sr. Mary's
- 12 presidency have further enabled campus expansion and growth; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary is president of the Middle States
- 14 Association of Colleges and Schools and frequently serves on
- 15 evaluation teams for other colleges and universities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary's recent honors include an honorary
- 17 doctorate of humane letters from Allentown College of Saint
- 18 Francis DeSales, Center Valley, and an honorary doctorate from
- 19 the University of Scranton; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary is a recipient of the Binghamton High
- 21 School Award, The Pennsylvania State University College of
- 22 Education alumni award and the St. Ignatius Award from Scranton
- 23 Preparatory School; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In 2004 the Council for Advancement and Support of
- 25 Education, a Washington, DC-based international association of
- 26 professionals who advance educational institutions, named Sr.
- 27 Mary "Outstanding Executive of the Year"; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Sr. Mary frequently writes and lectures about
- 29 Catholic education and general higher education issues in
- 30 addition to her convocation and commencement addresses; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Founded in 1915 by the Sisters, Servants of the
- 2 Immaculate Heart of Mary, Marywood was the first Catholic
- 3 women's college in this Commonwealth; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Marywood became a university in 1997, and the
- 5 restructuring into four colleges under university status
- 6 occurred in 2003; and
- WHEREAS, Marywood University enrolls more than 3,200
- 8 undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students and more than
- 9 8,000 continuing education students annually; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There are more than 28,000 living Marywood alumni;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, On May 4, 2007, Marywood University is honoring Sr.
- 13 Mary for her commitment to Marywood and to academic excellence;
- 14 therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives join with
- 16 Marywood University in honoring Sr. Mary Reap, IHM, Ph.D., and
- 17 designate May 4, 2007, as "Sister Mary Reap Day" in
- 18 Pennsylvania.
