A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Relating to participation in and legislative approval of
- 2 recommendations and reports of the Northeast Regional Haze
- 3 Planning Organization prior to implementation in
- 4 Pennsylvania, and urging the Department of Environmental
- 5 Protection to convene stakeholder process.
- 6 WHEREAS, The United States Environmental Protection Agency
- 7 (U.S. EPA) has promulgated regulations (64 Fed. Reg. 35713, July
- 8 1, 1999) establishing a long-term, 65-year program to address
- 9 sources of regional haze adversely affecting visibility at
- 10 certain national parks and wilderness areas pursuant to
- 11 authority vested by the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Congress has appropriated funds to U.S. EPA for the
- 13 establishment of Regional Planning Organizations (RPOs) to
- 14 assist states in the development of long-range plans for
- 15 addressing regional haze; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is a member of the
- 17 Ozone Transport Commission (OTC), which is serving as the
- 18 Northeast Regional Planning Organization for Regional Haze (NE
- 19 RPO) and which has been identified by U.S. EPA as one of five

- 1 RPOs to assist in the development of regional haze control plans
- 2 and policies; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Reducing emissions contributing to regional haze may
- 4 entail costly regulatory control strategies directed at many
- 5 sectors of economic activity in the Commonwealth of
- 6 Pennsylvania, including electric power generation, various
- 7 industrial and manufacturing processes, auto and truck
- 8 transportation, burning related to forestry and agriculture, and
- 9 construction activities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Control strategies for reducing regional haze could
- 11 overlap or duplicate those otherwise required to comply with the
- 12 National Ambient Air Quality Standards promulgated and revised
- 13 from time to time by U.S. EPA for the protection of public
- 14 health and welfare; and
- WHEREAS, Reducing regional haze and protecting visibility in
- 16 a cost-effective manner is important to the people and economy
- 17 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, is an interstate issue
- 18 concerning public welfare, is highly technical and complex and
- 19 is subject to alternative control approaches; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has taken leadership in the involvement
- 21 of stakeholders for the solution of complex environmental
- 22 problems through the Department of Environmental Protection's
- 23 Southwest Pennsylvania Ozone Stakeholders and Lehigh
- 24 Valley/Southeastern Pennsylvania Ozone Stakeholders processes;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, U.S. EPA regulations providing guidance for the
- 27 deliberations of regional planning organizations contemplate
- 28 stakeholder involvement in RPO planning and decision making; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Enhancing public notice and participation in the
- 30 regional haze activities of the Northeast Regional Planning

- 1 Organization for Regional Haze, including the development of
- 2 recommendations, reports or interpretations, will help to ensure
- 3 public confidence in the fairness of any regulatory requirements
- 4 that may be proposed for implementation by the Commonwealth of
- 5 Pennsylvania; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
- 7 Pennsylvania concurring), That the Secretary of Environmental
- 8 Protection of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be encouraged to
- 9 attend and participate in the proceedings of the OTC acting in
- 10 its capacity as Northeast Regional Planning Organization for
- 11 Regional Haze and that the Secretary of Environmental Protection
- 12 provide an annual report of the activities of the Northeast
- 13 Regional Planning Organization for Regional Haze to the General
- 14 Assembly; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of Environmental Protection
- 16 convene a stakeholder process among public and private sector
- 17 representatives in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to help
- 18 develop policies and positions on control strategies for
- 19 regional haze for communication to the Northeast Regional
- 20 Planning Organization for Regional Haze, such process to include
- 21 representatives of the General Assembly, the Pennsylvania Public
- 22 Utility Commission, public interest and environmental
- 23 organizations and affected industries; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of Environmental Protection seek
- 25 to ensure that any reports or recommendations of the Northeast
- 26 Regional Planning Organization for Regional Haze are consistent
- 27 with the energy and environmental policies of the Commonwealth
- 28 of Pennsylvania as reflected by the acts of the General
- 29 Assembly; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That, except as otherwise may be required by

- 1 Federal law, no final recommendations or report or other action
- 2 of the Northeast Regional Planning Organization for Regional
- 3 Haze impose any new or different requirements upon the regulated
- 4 community or citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania unless
- 5 approved or enacted by the General Assembly; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 7 the Governor; each member of the Congress of the United States
- 8 from Pennsylvania; the Secretary of Environmental Protection;
- 9 the chairman, members and executive director of the Pennsylvania
- 10 Public Utility Commission; the Administrator and Region III
- 11 Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection
- 12 Agency; and the executive director of the Northeast Ozone
- 13 Transport Commission.
