## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund 2 and the Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund
- 3 Commission; prescribing the membership and powers of the
- 4 commission; providing certain insurance surcharges; and
- 5 making an appropriation.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Legislative findings and declaration.
- 9 The General Assembly finds and declares that:
- 10 (1) Although the majority of Americans are covered by
- 11 some form of health insurance, families nevertheless lack
- 12 protection against the high cost of chronic or single
- 13 episodes of serious illness that may destroy their resources.
- 14 An illness resulting in this potentially devastating
- 15 financial consequence is referred to as a catastrophic
- illness.

- 1 (2) Catastrophic illnesses often threaten to push some
- 2 families into bankruptcy and others toward seeking inferior
- 3 medical care or postponing prompt treatment and present a
- 4 major problem for this nation's health care system in that
- 5 catastrophic illnesses account for over 20% of this nation's
- 6 health expenditures.
- 7 (3) The impact of catastrophic illnesses on the family
- 8 is especially acute in that children have the highest average
- 9 medical costs among the population as a whole.
- 10 (4) It is the public policy of this Commonwealth that
- each child of this Commonwealth should have access to quality
- health care and adequate protection against the
- extraordinarily high costs of health care services which are
- determined to be catastrophic and which severely impact upon
- 15 a child and his family.
- 16 (5) To this end, it is incumbent upon the Commonwealth
- 17 to provide assistance to children and their families whose
- 18 medical expenses extend beyond the families' available
- 19 resources.
- 20 Section 2. Definitions.
- 21 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 22 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 23 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Catastrophic illness." Any illness or condition the
- 25 necessary medical expenses of which are not covered by any other
- 26 State, Federal or other governmental program or any insurance
- 27 contract and which exceed 30% of the income of a family whose
- 28 income is \$100,000 or less per year or 40% of the income of a
- 29 family whose income is over \$100,000 per year.
- 30 "Child." A person under 18 years of age.

- 1 "Commission." The Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief
- 2 Fund Commission.
- 3 "Family." A child and the child's parent, parents or legal
- 4 guardian, as the case may be, who is legally responsible for the
- 5 child's medical expenses.
- 6 "Fund." The Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund.
- 7 "Income." All income, from whatever source derived, actually
- 8 received by a family.
- 9 "Resident." A person legally domiciled within this
- 10 Commonwealth for a period of six months immediately preceding
- 11 the onset of the illness or accident. Mere seasonal or temporary
- 12 residence within this Commonwealth, of whatever duration, does
- 13 not constitute domicile. Absence from this Commonwealth for a
- 14 period of 12 months or more is prima facie evidence of
- 15 abandonment of domicile. The burden of establishing legal
- 16 domicile within this Commonwealth is upon the parent or legal
- 17 quardian of a child.
- 18 Section 3. Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund.
- 19 (a) Fund established.--The Catastrophic Illness in Children
- 20 Relief Fund is established as a nonlapsing, revolving fund. The
- 21 fund shall be administered by the commission and shall be
- 22 credited with moneys received pursuant to section 8.
- 23 (b) Custodian of fund.--The State Treasurer is the custodian
- 24 of the fund, and all disbursements from the fund shall be made
- 25 by the State Treasurer upon vouchers signed by the chairman of
- 26 the commission. The moneys in the fund shall be invested and
- 27 reinvested by the State Treasurer as are other trust funds in
- 28 the custody of the State Treasurer in the manner provided by
- 29 law. Interest received on the moneys in the fund shall be
- 30 credited to the fund.

- 1 Section 4. Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund
- 2 Commission.
- 3 (a) Commission established.--There is hereby created an
- 4 independent administrative commission which shall be known as
- 5 the Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund Commission. The
- 6 commission shall consist of the Secretary of Health, the
- 7 Secretary of Public Welfare, the Insurance Commissioner and the
- 8 State Treasurer, who shall be members ex officio, and five
- 9 public members who are residents of this Commonwealth, appointed
- 10 by the Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the
- 11 members elected to the Senate for terms of five years, one of
- 12 whom is appointed upon the recommendation of the President pro
- 13 tempore of the Senate and is a provider of health care services
- 14 to children in this Commonwealth and one of whom is appointed
- 15 upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
- 16 Representatives and is a provider of health care services to
- 17 children in this Commonwealth. The five public members first
- 18 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of one, two,
- 19 three, four and five years, respectively. Each member shall hold
- 20 office for the term of his appointment and until his successor
- 21 has been appointed and qualified. A member of the commission is
- 22 eligible for reappointment. Each ex officio member of the
- 23 commission may designate an officer employee of his department
- 24 to represent him at meetings of the commission, and each
- 25 designee may lawfully vote and otherwise act on behalf of the
- 26 member for whom he constitutes the designee. Any designation
- 27 shall be in writing, delivered to the commission, and filed with
- 28 the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth and shall
- 29 continue in effect until revoked or amended in the same manner
- 30 as provider for designation.

- 1 (b) Removal.--Each member of the commission may be removed
- 2 from office by the Governor, for cause, after a public hearing
- 3 and may be suspended by the Governor pending the completion of
- 4 the hearing. Each member of the commission, before entering upon
- 5 his duties, shall take and subscribe an oath to perform the
- 6 duties of his office faithfully, impartially and justly to the
- 7 best of his ability. A record of the oaths shall be filed in the
- 8 office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
- 9 (c) Vacancies.--Any vacancies in the membership of the
- 10 commission occurring other than by the expiration of a term
- 11 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment,
- 12 but for the unexpired term only.
- 13 (d) Chairman and officers. -- The Secretary of Health shall be
- 14 chairman and chief executive officer of the commission. The
- 15 members shall elect a secretary and a treasurer who need not be
- 16 members of the commission, and the same person may be elected to
- 17 serve both as secretary and treasurer.
- 18 (e) Quorum. -- The powers of the commission are vested in the
- 19 members thereof in office from time to time, and six members of
- 20 the commission shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the
- 21 commission. Action may be taken and motions and resolutions
- 22 adopted by the commission at any meeting by the affirmative vote
- 23 of at least six members of the commission. A vacancy in the
- 24 membership of the commission shall not impair the right of a
- 25 quorum to exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of
- 26 the commission.
- 27 (f) Expenses.--The members of the commission shall serve
- 28 without compensation, but the commission shall reimburse its
- 29 members for the reasonable expenses incurred in the performance
- 30 of their duties based upon the moneys available in the fund.

- 1 (g) Appointment. -- The commission shall be appointed within
- 2 three months after the effective date of this act and shall
- 3 organize as soon as may be practicable after the appointment of
- 4 its members.
- 5 Section 5. Powers and duties of commission.
- 6 The commission shall have, but not be limited to, the
- 7 following powers and duties:
- 8 (1) To establish, in cooperation with the Department of
- 9 Health, a program for the purposes of this act, administer
- 10 the fund and authorize the payment or reimbursement of the
- 11 medical expenses of children with catastrophic illnesses.
- 12 (2) To establish procedures for enrollment in the
- program, determine the eligibility for the payment or
- 14 reimbursement of medical expenses for each child, process
- 15 claim disputes and establish procedures to provide that, in
- the case of an illness or condition for which the family,
- 17 after receiving assistance pursuant to this act, recovers
- damages for the child's medical expenses pursuant to a
- 19 settlement or judgment in a legal action, the family shall
- reimburse the fund for the amount of assistance received, or
- 21 that portion thereof covered by the amount of the damages
- less the expense of recovery.
- 23 (3) To establish the amount of reimbursement for the
- 24 medical expenses of each eligible child using a formula based
- on a family's ability to pay for medical expenses which takes
- 26 into account family size, family income and available assets
- and family medical expenses and to adjust the financial
- 28 eligibility criteria established in the definition of
- 29 "catastrophic illness" in section 2, based upon the moneys
- 30 available in the fund.

- 1 (4) To disseminate information on the fund and the 2 program to the public.
- 2 program to the public.
- 3 (5) To adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs
- 4 and the conduct of its business, adopt an official seal and
- 5 alter the same at pleasure, maintain an office at the place
- 6 within this Commonwealth as it may designate, and sue and be
- 7 sued in its own name.
- 8 (6) To employ professional and clerical assistance
- 9 necessary to perform its duties, and as may be within the
- 10 limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to
- 11 it for its purposes.
- 12 (7) To maintain confidential records on each child who
- applies for assistance under the fund.
- 14 (8) To do all other acts and things necessary or
- convenient to carry out the purposes of this act.
- 16 (9) To adopt rules and regulations in the manner
- 17 provided in the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240),
- 18 referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, necessary to
- 19 effectuate the purposes of this act.
- 20 Section 6. Enrollment in program.
- 21 A child who is a resident of this Commonwealth shall be
- 22 eligible, through his parent or legal guardian, to enroll in the
- 23 program established pursuant to section 5(1).
- 24 Section 7. Eligibility.
- Whenever a child has a catastrophic illness and is enrolled
- 26 in the program, the child, through his parent or legal guardian,
- 27 shall be eligible for financial assistance from moneys in the
- 28 fund, subject to the rules and regulations established by the
- 29 commission and the availability of moneys in the fund. The
- 30 financial assistance shall include, but not be limited to,

- 1 payments or reimbursements for the cost of medical treatment,
- 2 hospital care, drugs, nursing care, rehabilitative services and
- 3 physician services.
- 4 Section 8. Funding.
- 5 For the purpose of providing the moneys necessary to
- 6 establish and meet the purposes of the fund, the commission
- 7 shall establish a \$1 annual surcharge per person upon all
- 8 individual and group health insurance policies written in this
- 9 Commonwealth. The \$1 surcharge also shall be applied to every
- 10 enrollee in a health maintenance organization authorized to
- 11 operate in this Commonwealth. The surcharge shall be collected
- 12 by the commission and paid over to the State Treasurer for
- 13 deposit in the fund annually as provided by the commission. The
- 14 surcharge is a separate charge to the insured or enrollee in
- 15 addition to the premium to be paid and shall be reflected as
- 16 such in the policy or evidence of coverage, and commissions
- 17 shall not be payable thereon. The insurer or health maintenance
- 18 organization is prohibited from absorbing the surcharge as an
- 19 inducement for insurance or enrollment or for any other reason.
- 20 In the case of self-insured groups of ten or more persons, an
- 21 annual contribution of \$1 per person shall be required, and
- 22 shall be collected by the commission and paid over to the State
- 23 Treasurer for deposit in the fund.
- 24 Section 9. Rules for collection of surcharge.
- 25 The State Treasurer shall adopt rules and regulations in the
- 26 manner provided in the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240),
- 27 referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, establishing
- 28 procedures for the collection of the surcharge and contribution.
- 29 Section 10. Reports.
- The commission shall report annually to the Governor, the

- 1 Health and Welfare Committee of the House of Representatives and
- 2 the Public Health and Welfare Committee of the Senate on the
- 3 status of the program. The report shall include information
- 4 about the number of participants in the program, average
- 5 expenditures per participant, the nature and type of
- 6 catastrophic illnesses for which the fund provided financial
- 7 assistance, and the average income and expenditures of families
- 8 who received financial assistance under the program. The
- 9 commission also may make recommendations for changes in the law
- 10 and regulations governing the fund.
- 11 Section 11. Appropriation.
- 12 The sum of \$300,000 is hereby appropriated to the
- 13 Catastrophic Illness in Children Relief Fund Commission for
- 14 administrative and other costs in establishing the program
- 15 provided for by this act.
- 16 Section 12. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
