## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing October 15, 2013, as "Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes the serious
- 4 toll of pregnancy loss and infant mortality in our communities;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Through public awareness of pregnancy and infant
- 7 loss we can respond to affected individuals and families with
- 8 greater compassion and appropriate resources; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day unites and
- 10 supports persons who have experienced loss through miscarriage,
- 11 stillbirth or neonatal or infant death and further promotes
- 12 awareness so devastated families do not have to silently grieve
- 13 their losses; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Up to 20% of known pregnancies end in miscarriage;
- 15 and

- 1 WHEREAS, The World Health Organization has reported that 4.5
- 2 million stillbirths occur each year worldwide; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Public health agencies, health care providers and
- 4 communities must work together to further reduce the infant
- 5 mortality rate in the United States, where as many as 25,000
- 6 infants die each year; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The infant mortality rate in this Commonwealth in
- 8 2010 was 7.3 per 1,035 live births; and
- 9 WHEREAS, As individuals and communities we can promote
- 10 understanding of the incidence of pregnancy and infant loss and
- 11 the associated burden of grief and commit to appropriately
- 12 addressing the needs of bereaved parents and family members;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives, acknowledging
- 15 the anguish of pregnancy or infant loss and the need to
- 16 facilitate healing in its aftermath, recognize October 15, 2013,
- 17 as "Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania.
