| 18 | Section 1. The act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known |
| 19 | as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, is amended by |

| 21 | Section 435. All counsel fees agreed upon by the claimant |

Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
