AN ACT

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 2 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of 3 4 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, 5 consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto, " defining "pharmacy technician" and "immediate supervision"; 6 and providing for registration, qualifications and 8 supervision of pharmacy technicians. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, amended December 12 20, 1985 (P.L.433, No.111), is amended by adding definitions to 13 14 read: Section 2. Definitions. -- As used in this act: 15 16 (14) "Pharmacy technician" means an individual who is 17 registered with the State Board of Pharmacy as a pharmacy 18 19 technician and who may assist in the practice of pharmacy under

- 1 the immediate supervision of a licensed pharmacist after meeting
- 2 the requirements of this act and the rules and regulations
- 3 promulgated pursuant to this act.
- 4 (15) "Immediate supervision" means a level of control which
- 5 <u>assures that a pharmacist has the ultimate responsibility for</u>
- 6 the accuracy, safety and patient outcome with respect to the
- 7 actions of pharmacy technicians and pharmacist interns and the
- 8 use of automation in all practice settings.
- 9 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 <u>Section 3.3. Pharmacy Technician Registration</u>,
- 11 Qualifications and Supervision. -- (a) The board shall have the
- 12 power to adopt rules and regulations governing the use of
- 13 pharmacy technicians and the duties of pharmacy technicians in
- 14 pharmacies licensed by the board, provided that pharmacy
- 15 <u>technicians be responsible to and under the immediate</u>
- 16 <u>supervision of a pharmacist licensed by the board and that the</u>
- 17 ratio of pharmacy technicians to supervising pharmacists not
- 18 exceed two-to-one.
- 19 (b) A pharmacy technician shall be required to register with
- 20 the board biennially, on a form prescribed by the board, and pay
- 21 <u>a registration fee as determined by the board. The board shall</u>
- 22 have the power to adopt rules and regulations governing the
- 23 registration of pharmacy technicians and to determine and issue
- 24 standards for recognition and approval of training programs for
- 25 pharmacy technicians. Such rules and regulations shall:
- 26 (1) require that a pharmacy technician have a high school
- 27 diploma or a high school equivalency certificate or be working
- 28 to achieve an equivalent diploma or certificate; and
- 29 (2) have passed a board-approved pharmacy technician
- 30 certification examination.

- 1 (c) The board shall renew, revoke or suspend the
- 2 registration of pharmacy technicians pursuant to rules and
- 3 regulations promulgated by the board. All actions of the board
- 4 shall be taken subject to the right of notice, hearing and
- 5 <u>adjudication</u> and the right of appeal therefrom in accordance
- 6 with 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law and procedure).
- 7 (d) Unless ordered to do so by a court, the board shall not
- 8 reinstate the registration of a person to practice as a pharmacy
- 9 technician which has been revoked, and such person shall be
- 10 required to apply for registration after a five-year period in
- 11 accordance with this section, if such person desires to practice
- 12 at any time after such revocation.
- 13 Section 3. The board shall promulgate the regulations
- 14 required by section 3.3 of the act within one year of the
- 15 effective date of this section.
- 16 Section 4. No person shall be required to register as a
- 17 pharmacy technician under section 3.3 of the act until 18 months
- 18 after the effective date of this section.
- 19 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
