| 10 | Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be |
| 11 | necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of |
| 12 | Pennsylvania State University, for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 |
| 13 | to June 30, 1984, for the following purposes and amounts: |
| 14 | (1) For educational and general expenses \$109,041,000 |
| 15 | (2) For cost of student aid 1,760,000 |
| 16 | (3) For cost of research |
| 17 | (4) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only 3,160,000 |
| 18 | (5) For cost of agricultural research 11,820,000 |
| 19 | (6) For cost of agricultural extension |
| 20 | services |

1 (7) For cost of operating Elizabethtown

Section 3. If necessary, Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (2), (3), (5) and (6). The aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) The monthly payments shall be made in accordance with section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which the payment is to be made.

22 Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General 23 Appropriation Act of 1983 relating to the payment of retirement 24 expenses, the Trustees of Pennsylvania State University shall 25 make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement 26 Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act. 27 Section 6. (a) Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for the purposes 28 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper 29 30 records showing the application of the moneys. Not later than 19830H1023B1180 - 2 -

120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act 1 2 relates, Pennsylvania State University shall file with the 3 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor 4 General a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of 5 all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during the fiscal year, as provided in 6 7 section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during the fiscal year. 8

The statement of expenditures and costs shall be 9 (b) 10 reviewed by the Auditor General who has the right, in respect to 11 the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow 12 expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to 13 cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Pennsylvania State 14 University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures 15 made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated 16 by this act, the Auditor General has the right to review only 17 and shall file annually with the General Assembly any 18 information concerning these expenditures as the General 19 Assembly or any of its committees may require.

20 Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and 21 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and 22 House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be 23 submitted prior to September 1, 1984, shall cover the 12-month 24 25 period beginning with the summer term 1983 and shall include: 26 (1) The following counts and distributions for each term 27 during the period:

28 (i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed 29 full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time 30 students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students 19830H1023B1180 - 3 - enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students
 enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled
 in undergraduate courses.

4 (ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit
5 hours, divided into lower division and upper division course
6 levels and of graduate student credit hours divided into three
7 course levels: master's, first professional and doctoral.
8 (iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of
9 instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction
10 at each level of instruction.

11 (iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof. (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in 12 13 total and for each two-digit Hegis category of instructional programs in higher education as defined by the National Center 14 15 for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education, 16 a classification of faculty members or other professional 17 employees by title including: professor, associate professor, 18 assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, 19 librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other 20 professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type 21 of assignment: teaching and nonteaching, with each set of 22 faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the 23 24 following aggregates for each subdivided classification: 25 (i) The number of faculty and other professional employees

26 and their full-time equivalence in instructional and 27 noninstructional functions.

28 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom 29 courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom 30 courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, 19830H1023B1180 - 4 - 1 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

2 (iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate
3 individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned
4 to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into
5 lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and
6 doctoral course levels.

7 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 8 9 generated; divided into lower division, upper division, 10 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 11 (v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction 12 13 student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course 14 15 levels.

16 (vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and 17 for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary 18 paid for each of these functions from college or university 19 funds, Federal funds and other funds.

20 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 21 member employed full-time identified by two-digit Hegis category 22 and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related 23 activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate 24 25 classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in 26 preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public 27 service.

28 Section 8. (a) In addition to the requirements in section 7 29 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month 30 period beginning with the summer term 1983 shall include for all 19830H1023B1180 - 5 - 1 programs of the university:

2 (1) The minimum number of credits required for a3 baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

4 (2) The number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees,
5 first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1981,
6 1982, 1983 and estimated 1984.

7 (b) Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues 8 and expenditures and present its financial statements required 9 under the provisions of this act in accordance with the "Higher 10 Education Finance Manual of 1975."

11 Section 9. Pennsylvania State University shall provide such 12 information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of 13 this act and in the form and manner as the Department of 14 Education may prescribe.

15 Section 10. Pennsylvania State University shall report its 16 revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements 17 required under the provisions of this act in accordance with 18 generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for 19 educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education 20 Finance Manual of 1975," with the exceptions set forth in the 21 "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1983-1984." Credits 22 granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong 23 learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof 24 shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and 25 included under "Public Service." 26

27 Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1983 or, if 28 enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

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
