## AN ACT

$ \begin{array}{c} 1\\2\\3\\4\\5\\6\\7\\8\\9\\1\\1\\1\\2\\1\\3\\1\\4\end{array} $	Amending the act of May 28, 1937 (P.L.1053, No.286), entitled "An act relating to the regulation of public utilities; defining as public utilities certain corporations, companies, associations, and persons; providing for the regulation of public utilities, including, to a limited extent, municipalities engaging in public utility business, by prescribing, defining, and limiting their duties, powers, and liabilities, and regulating the exercise, surrender or abandonment of their powers, privileges, and franchises; defining and regulating contract carriers by motor vehicle and brokers in order to regulate effectively common carriers by motor vehicle; conferring upon the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission the power and duty of supervising and regulating persons, associations, companies, and
15	corporations, including, to a limited extent, municipal
16	corporations subject to this act, and administering the
17	provisions of this act; authorizing the commission to fix
18	temporary rates; placing the burden of proof on public
19	utilities to sustain their rates and certain other matters;
20	authorizing a permissive or mandatory sliding scale method of
21	regulating rates; providing for the supervision of financial
22	and contractural relations between public utilities and
23	affiliated interests, and supervision and regulation of
24	accounts and securities or obligations issued, assumed, or
25	kept by persons, associations, companies, corporations or
26	municipal corporations subject to this act; conferring upon
27	the commission power to vary, reform, or revise certain
28	contracts; conferring upon the commission the exclusive power
29	to regulate or order the construction, alteration,
30	relocation, protection, or abolition of crossings of
31 32	facilities of public utilities, and of such facilities by or over public highways, to appropriate property for the

construction or improvement of such crossings, and to award 1 2 or apportion resultant costs and damages; authorizing owners of such property to sue the Commonwealth for such damages; 3 4 providing for ejectment proceedings in connection with the 5 appropriation of property for crossings; conferring upon the 6 commission power to control and regulate budgets of public 7 utilities; imposing upon persons, associations, companies, 8 and corporations (except municipal corporations) subject to 9 regulation, the cost of administering this act; prescribing 10 and regulating practice and procedure before the commission and procedure for review by the courts of commission action; 11 12 giving the court of common pleas of Dauphin County exclusive 13 original jurisdiction over certain proceedings; prescribing 14 penalties, fines, and imprisonment for violations of the 15 provisions of this act and regulations and orders of the commission, and the procedure for enforcing such fines and 16 17 penalties; and repealing legislation supplied and superseded 18 by or inconsistent with this act," conferring certain powers on the Public Utility Commission in times of declared 19 20 emergency. 21 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 22 hereby enacts as follows: 23 Section 1. The act of May 28, 1937 (P.L.1053, No.286), known 24 as the "Public Utility Law," is amended by adding a section to 25 read: 26 Section 923. Powers in Times of Declared Emergency.--(a) The Public Utility Commission shall, in times of declared 27 emergency, have the power to close businesses, schools, and 28 other energy users. The Public Utility Commission shall 29 30 promulgate rules and regulations including a priority of 31 closings to effectuate the purposes of this section. 32 (b) In times of declared emergency, the Public Utility Commission shall take into account, in all administrative 33 34 actions, whether establishments are making good faith efforts to comply with law before penalizing these establishments for 35 36 noncompliance.

37 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
