## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), entitled "An 2 act providing for the planning and regulation of solid waste 3 storage, collection, transportation, processing, treatment, and disposal; requiring municipalities to submit plans for 5 municipal waste management systems in their jurisdictions; 6 authorizing grants to municipalities; providing regulation of 7 the management of municipal, residual and hazardous waste; 8 requiring permits for operating hazardous waste and solid waste storage, processing, treatment, and disposal 9 facilities; and licenses for transportation of hazardous 10 11 waste; imposing duties on persons and municipalities; 12 granting powers to municipalities; authorizing the Environmental Quality Board and the Department of 13 14 Environmental Resources to adopt rules, regulations, 15 standards and procedures; granting powers to and imposing duties upon county health departments; providing remedies; 16 17 prescribing penalties; and establishing a fund, " requiring 18 municipal approval for the application of sewage sludge. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows: 21 Section 1. Section 504 of the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), known as the Solid Waste Management Act, is amended to 23 read:
- 24 Section 504. Approval by governing body.
- 25 (a) General rule.--Applications for a permit shall be

- 1 reviewed by the appropriate county, county planning agency or
- 2 county health department where they exist and the host
- 3 municipality, and they may recommend to the department
- 4 conditions upon, revisions to, or disapproval of the permit only
- 5 if specific cause is identified. In such case the department
- 6 shall be required to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin its
- 7 justification for overriding the county's recommendations. If
- 8 the department does not receive comments within 60 days, the
- 9 county shall be deemed to have waived its right to review.
- 10 (b) Sewage sludge. -- The application of sewage sludge on any
- 11 field or other area for fertilization purposes shall require the
- 12 approval of the governing body of the municipality encompassing
- 13 <u>such property.</u>
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
