## AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 7, 1982 (P.L.228, No.74), entitled "An act relating to noxious weeds; creating a Noxious Weed 2 3 Control Committee and defining its powers and duties; 4 imposing powers and duties on the Secretary of Agriculture and municipalities; providing penalties; and making a repeal," further providing for the sale and control of 6 bamboo. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of April 7, 1982 (P.L.228, No.74), known as the Noxious Weed Control Law, is amended by 11 12 adding definitions to read: "Bamboo." Any monopodial plant species belonging to the 13 subfamily Bambusoideae. 14 15 "Rhizome barrier." A concrete, metal or high density plastic 16 17 which deflects the growth of bamboo rhizomes, also known as a 18 root barrier.
- 20 Section 2. Section 8 of the act, amended July 7, 1994

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- 1 (P.L.439, No.72), is amended to read:
- 2 Section 8. Noxious weed control list.
- 3 The noxious weed control list shall include but not be
- 4 limited to the following weeds:
- 5 (1) Cannabis sativa, commonly known as marihuana.
- 6 (2) Cirsium arvense, commonly known as Canadian thistle.
- 7 (3) Rosa multiflora, commonly known as multiflora rose.
- 8 (4) Sorghum halepense, commonly known as Johnson grass.
- 9 (5) Bamboo, when established without a rhizome barrier.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
