A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating April 27, 2001, as "Arbor Day" and promoting public participation in the celebration.
- 3 WHEREAS, Tree have proved to be a valuable component of our
- 4 environment by providing a natural aesthetic for landscaping, a
- 5 biological tool to control water and wind erosion, a renewable
- 6 source of food, fuel and lumber for man, a habitat for birds and
- 7 wildlife and a site for oxygen and water release through
- 8 transpiration; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The original "Arbor Day" was observed with the
- 10 planting of more than a million trees; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Scientists, environmentalists, foresters and
- 12 government officials are increasingly alarmed by the significant
- 13 clearing and destruction of the forests of the world and are now
- 14 exploring the feasibility of large-scale reforestation programs
- 15 to prevent a possible adverse climate change such as global
- 16 warming; and

- 1 WHEREAS, "Arbor Day" has been designated by many states as a
- 2 time to recognize the value of trees in our environment and is
- 3 now celebrated throughout the United States and around the
- 4 world; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The last Friday in April is commonly observed as
- 6 "Arbor Day"; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate April 27, 2001, as "Arbor
- 8 Day"; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate ask that citizens and communities
- 10 throughout this Commonwealth participate in "Arbor Day" by
- 11 planting trees in appropriate public places as a source of
- 12 future enjoyment and civic pride.
