A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the President and Congress of the United States to
- 2 amend regulations that prohibit the use of Federal Medicaid
- 3 funds for prison MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION
- 4 PROGRAMS AND drug and alcohol rehabilitation programs.
- 5 WHEREAS, Studies have shown that approximately 80% of prison
- 6 inmates are affected by mental health/mental retardation and
- 7 drug and alcohol problems; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Studies have confirmed that 33% of all criminal
- 9 justice costs are related to substance abuse; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Data indicates that 40% of State prisoners will be
- 11 released in the next 12 months and studies demonstrate that
- 12 approximately 50% to 60% of inmates released from prison will
- 13 reengage in criminal activity; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 1999 approximately 3,773,600 American adults were
- 15 on probation and nearly 713,000 were on parole with minimal
- 16 substance abuse treatment; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Research has proven that rehabilitation programs
- 18 sharply reduce rates of recidivism, thereby ending a vicious and

- 1 socially destructive cycle of entry and exit from prison; and
- 2 WHEREAS, By providing funds to establish drug and alcohol
- 3 rehabilitation programs in State and county prisons, the State
- 4 will be able to reduce the judicial and operational costs
- 5 associated with repeat offenders and recidivism; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Current law prohibits the use of Federal Medicaid
- 7 funds for drug and alcohol rehabilitation programs in prisons
- 8 under 42 CFR § 435.1009 (relating to definitions relating to
- 9 institutional status); therefore be it AND
- 10 WHEREAS, CURRENT LAW ALSO PROHIBITS THE USE OF FEDERAL
- 11 MEDICAID FUNDS FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION
- 12 TREATMENT PROGRAMS IN PRISONS UNDER 42 CFR § 435.1009 (RELATING
- 13 TO DEFINITIONS RELATING TO INSTITUTIONAL STATUS); AND
- 14 WHEREAS, TREATMENT SHOULD LEAD TO A DECREASE IN RECIDIVISM
- 15 AMONG PRISONERS AFFLICTED WITH MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL
- 16 RETARDATION PROBLEMS; THEREFORE BE IT
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 memorialize the President and Congress of the United States to
- 19 amend 42 CFR § 435.1009 to permit the use of Federal Medicaid
- 20 funds for prison MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION TREATMENT <-

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- 21 PROGRAMS AND drug and alcohol rehabilitation programs and
- 22 thereby afford states throughout the nation the ability to
- 23 reduce recidivism and lower crime through prison PRISON-
- 24 ADMINISTERED TREATMENT AND rehabilitation programs; and be it
- 25 further
- 26 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 27 the President, the presiding officers of each house of Congress
- 28 and to each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
